William de Sporle grants to Sir Robert de Burgate & heirs all his right etc. in a piece of arable land in village of Burgate in field called Brakelond, between land of Mauser Berte & land formerly of William le Reve, abutting on one side on the highway (viam regalem) which is called Aldermannesweye & on the other on the land of William le Bretoun, for which Sir Robert pays one mark.

Witnesses: Peter de Burgate, William Bretoun, Godman Enwyne, Adam Cissor, Alan de Gislingham, Andrew Waryn, Robert Furnage, Martin de Wynefeld, and others.
