William de Northall of Burgate grants to William, son of Sir Robert de Burgate, Kt., for his service & $\frac{1}{2}$ mark of silver a piece of his house in the village of Burgate, between his own house on the south & house of Geoffrey Cuckuc on the north & abutting on the west on his croft & on the east on the common moor(~~more~~) of Burgate; & said piece of house is $8\frac{1}{2}$ perches long & $3\frac{1}{3}$ perches wide. Giving capital lord of the fee annually one halfpenny at Michaelmas.
