This bill indented made the xxvth day of July in the xxxvth year of the reign of our most dread
 sovereign lord Henry the eighth by the grace of god King of England France & Ireland defend
 of the parts And of the things of England also of Ireland in the presence of his most honorable
 witnesses that I Richard Vaughan came unto Sir Nicholas Bacon of London Esquire being
 present the day & were alone with John Collesley of London gentleman by the hand of
 his son Thomas Collesley the sum of the forest eight pounds six shillings & eight pence
 of good and lawful money of England to him of my said master on a reckoning and made
 of payment of a more sum due before the feast of the Nativity of Saint John Baptist
 last past unto my said master for & upon a conditional bargain and sale of certain
 messuages land & tenements in London & the suburbs of the same In witness
 whereof the said Thomas Collesley & the said Richard Vaughan to these presents
 interchangeably have put their seals & subscribed my own names the day and year
 above said.
