should be so.

And as to the selling of Burfold woode, I would be
glad to understand the regard of the doyngs of it, and
what men will take, for the selling diting and quytting
selling of A Ridd, and Expresson, I will ~~not~~ resolve
what shall be done, and he son I be advertised he better
it was sent forth in my name, and I am sure that
I was not advertised of it before his tyme, and therfore
let it now be done out of hand

And as touching the case of Burgate
and knowledge therof, that every man shall for my oxymoron
eat by, as the manner of Arad be, that he doth, and
the custom be to the contrary, w^{ch} is unknowne to me
This is true where he hath is led by upon Land
And what it is led by upon good and cattle how it
must be answered according to the state of good
and cattle that men possess, because you have not written
to me in these matters, therfore I am to see in them
And as touching the Advertises byll George Murre
come I have sayd nothing. Have you well from
my longe love & serving wyfe this 28 of November
1573

It semeth to me that I should have
my serving wyfe by him that you sent
up wth the letters, w^{ch} I do not allowe
of, nor cannot end my serving wyfe
by you self, and therfore am dyssatisfied
touching of them byll the most harme
that you maye cause w^{ch} I have no liking
and yet I must be content wth all
