Some, I send yo<sup>m</sup> gearis & I haue sent me by 25000.  
Wcham haue remembred me of that severall men to haue  
in his place for keeping of my servantes, wcham & his  
bste of Andronnes. But bcause he tolde me that he  
wold removre his dwelling from Kynyngham to Ely  
where he cannot be gone & cannot be fit for that  
purpose, And as to Ely, I thinke he was never  
acquainted wch keeping of servants; And as to the  
said wcham for age, and wcham for servants, I doubt  
none he shalbe or able to go therewer no farr. I  
report my selfe resely upon Andronnes bcause  
I know hym both first and honest, But yet I will  
not resolute leper till I speake wch hym, and after  
heare from yo<sup>m</sup>, or speake wch yo<sup>m</sup>, these be matters  
of paynes that I may great raynes and diligencie  
and so doyle her taking of my amoniate snyre good will  
and I doubt wcham Andronnes hathe beene acquaynted  
wch his frind. The man that yo<sup>m</sup> and I talked of wcham  
he shall haue to take amoniate, or no, I doubt not. Neche  
do I know wcham frind to be wcham he will aske these  
matters wcham shall consider for he well regouering  
of this man, shall stand both yo<sup>m</sup>, and me, in very great  
need, Agayne of we shall agre upon hym that we  
first talked of when were it mete that he come upp  
and yo<sup>m</sup> wch hym to understand his regardes althouge  
yo<sup>m</sup> tarried but a daye. Content me to yo<sup>m</sup> moche  
and to my deuyght god blesse he Andronnes. And  
so fare yo<sup>m</sup> well. From my house at Sorgambury
