for the Admirallie within the countie of Norff and Suff with the
profite of the same be appon the deaht of Anthony Stile the elder the
late exerexer of the saide offices lawfully vested in Anthony Stile the
younger, sonne of the foresaid Anthony the elder, & by seuerall grants
and patent made by me may at large appear, I haue therfore
thonght good to remynd you to suffer the said Anthony Stile the younger
quietly and peaceably to Rose and exercize the saide offices as hath byn
assumed, without any your contradiction or impediment, And that from
henceforth you accept and take him for lawfull Clark or Regester and a
Submarshall in the countie aforesaid according to the seuerall tenors
of the patent made in this behalfe. And so forth you will, from me
Comte at Greenwich this 20th of Aprill 1583.
