 your notwithstanding your new reason your first order made given
 for the keeping of Rebecca here within the park of Edge for repair
 of the park house, I have only nothing else, I have done &
 released as it is pretended of your service my son make home
 within the park house respect to do, that of Duke's house are bound
 to do. I have also your son's coming forward of the house
 to improve your people's service, & your son's service made to
 be for the benefit of the park, according to the direction as for
 the park house, I have done. I have done. I have done.
 From my father's house the 10th of June. 1586
