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Mr Maure I pray you to sende ~~me~~ ^{me} by this
bearer y^e reste of y^e money due to me; by Sr Nicholas
Bacon, n^{ch}. by your account and mine this
other nyght, as I remember came to ~~the~~ twenty
three p^ounde, if Sr Nicholas Bacon require any
backe againe I wil repaye so muche backe to you as
he requirerth written this 8. of June. 159. *Drury.*

S^r so soon as occasion is offered, I shall not faile (god
witting) to see performed, as carefully as I can, the
effecte of yo^r letter delivred to me, but in the
meane time I am to aduertise you, that this
present day y^e fourtene of october, there cam
m^r Thomas Crofte, who kepeth at s^r willm
heydons, Robt Feknis gent, & Robt Hind,
yeman, s^r williams men, wth Richard Law-
son ^{Clarke} Parson of Lanerinsset, & James Leman
Laborer of honlt market, wth two others,
whose names as yet I can not learne but
by his instrument was a me^r of ground ^{& his servant}
theas men mesured one pease of ground on
thornage heath butteling on y^e north pt
to Lanerinsset, and is y^e pease where they
have used vsurpingly to com, & also ane
other part of thornage heath toward the
east, wth two peases of copping should lond
in y^e tenner & occupation of Henry Ba^{co}
of thornage afore ^{holder of this maner} sayd there vnto adioy-
ning, wthout y^e privitye either of you, my
La, or y^e tenant, lying farre distant from
y^e pease of y^e north part, as also from all
y^e lond, or liberty of sheapes conrse, of the
sayd s^r willm, Enen as they were fini-
shing this last p^rsell cam John Knighte my
La servant, who asked them what they
ded measuring, there, to whom y^e strang^r
whom he know not, answered for no ha-
rme wth like a found man he was satis-
fised wth, & so they all deputed. What may
be done in this case I beseeche yo^r wth
consider wth yo^r counsell, y^e this vntem-
perate dealing of him & his may be so
qualefied, as my La may enjoy his living
