hold lands within the Honour, 15 Feb. 1603 (4)

After my last recommendation received by virtue of my office of the
 Stewardship of the lands of the Lord of Clare in the County of Norfolk you have
 directed me from time to time certified of the Dependants or Customary
 lands and rents within the said Lord of Clare's Demesne lands depending or
 fallen. Whereupon the said Lord of Clare has been pleased to direct me of the
 same lands and rents. Whereupon I have been pleased to direct you to will
 and require you from time to time to see before to certify in writing or admit
 the same to the Dependants or Customary lands of the said Lord of Clare
 it may please be to me further signified unto you. And that present
 you send up a true certifiat of the the whole summe of the yearly rents
 of all the Dependant lands of the said Lord. And whether the same have

 there be upon the said Dependant lands. And whether there be any
 mine or metal of metall all rols or other things on them or any of them or
 any other matter of profits what should appertaining to the said Lord. And
 what is certified unto me the name or names of all the said the said
