Sir Nathaniel Bacon.

I have inquired after your daughter of Haris and I am
informed that she is now of your house for her husband in
her name who is a young man of a good wife who was
in your house and for your daughter Mary who
was in your house and Edward of London but now she is
removed to Lacy in Suffolk but I cannot learn her ladies
name, and so much for your daughter.

I have my Buckingham business to cannot express but
that they are so corrupted of state of their right as that
nothing will satisfy them nor can be proved in the right of
my lord: for the rest I might but intend you to signify unto
them, that if they will satisfy me in your opinion -
concerning the state of that right now you think to be such
belong unto my lord: and so with respect to your plans to take
allowance out of your house as shall be thought fit by me: to
put unto them, that you will send one of your men will tour
up to London where they have stayed where I will be willing
we will agree by consent to frame an action brought my lord:
and he to write and so will let Camus advise you a trial
to decide all for your contentment for your wife by my lord
shall advise your all or lose all, and truly for my lord
I see that nothing will do but that your clamorous men
be towards my lord: and his officers you go power of your
and the men being so strongly possessed of a greater right
you I am a fragile willer friend in your, no fault for him
to fill any of your parts thinking that they would have sought
but allowance by favor, but I see that. Well by my lord
you out to try it with my lord: and it notes as good for my
lord: so to be as to offer any other due, but for as much as his
lord: hath introduced me payed him so for my lord would
be very willing to be advised by you if you can go forward
any more that may advance you so far of my lord: and quite
to write I shall be willing to follow your directions
if you will any thing to London I purpose if you will
to ride towards London to more delay if you have any friends
to demand and let me understand your pleasure by your letter
and by my duty I am your humble servant and
your lord's power to command
