unto the tenor of my Lord's letter directed unto me
being dated at York the 10th day of June last past
for the ending of a controversy between Ogley and
myself depending in my Lord's court for the right of
Easton Customary lands spoken of in my memorie of
the 25th of present by which I desired my Lord to
that I offer my memorie (being a counsellor at law)
to call a counsellor so to read two courts to court
until a trial was said for my better understanding
the right of the same which after was performed upon
a writ of trespass was entered by myself against
Ogley for trespass supposed to be done in part of the
supposed land in question upon which process was
awarded against Ogley but he would not then appear
And the next day after that a notice writ was kept upon
Ogley appeared by his attorney and pleaded a copy
of the plaintiff's declaration and also a day to
answer until the next court which was granted unto him
at which court Ogley by his said attorney pleaded unto
him not guilty to the said trespass and thereupon did
put him self upon the oath of my Lord's response
was awarded to my Lord of the said memorie for the
Customary courts to be at the next court And the
said being called returned his present for bond and
inclusion of the said Customary courts did then appear
and was sworn and adjured to answer upon the
said response the plaintiff did begin to set forth the
said title But he refused Ogley although he was then
in my Lord's court to appear to make
answer to the said answer in the said court of the said
refused to do so but did make default therefor
I was did give the said that the said Ogley was guilty
of the trespass in my Lord's court and set forth the said
complaint of him in his declaration and therefor the said
for the plaintiff and did give him three pence for damages
and pence for costs response Judgment was awarded on the
behalf of the plaintiff which was also given him according to
my Lord's good Lord's will in my Lord's court after I had read the
said writ and passed in the court of the said place and thus my
form in my Lord's court of the said my Lord's court was that I
