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Bacon, Sir Nathaniel. A.Ms. A note of dettes owing me set down this 22 of Novemb'r 1587. 7 plus pp., 4to.

Rough notes of personal accounts kept by the second son of the Lord Keeper, who became a member of Parliament in 1584 for Norfolk. He was a member of Gray's Inn and said to live in Stiffkey, Norfolk. The item is useful for its inclusion of Norfolk names, Corbet, Lincoln, Whitney, and the varied nature of his business.
