conthie to the forme effecte and the meauring of the oþer statute by þe ydne of the said statute is not so generallie and suchye put in exection as it ought to be
and for that cause doo the entitie to demauade of them and enemys of them so offendig for their. Generall offent and contumy. the come of reue pouned to þe
same Acte and statute more plenyfullie apperith. But yet neyther þat þe dñe esse of the said Justice and oþer. her Officier who haue offendid contumy to the
forme of the oþer statute and oþer noes charged and chyngible. With the oþer penaltie of reue pouned by euformacion in our. Count of Chancery haue and do
comitt them selbes wholie to our clementie and favou. Without standyng any thing in defens of them selbes in þe penuiles. And we haue enformed to assyndre
þomysle that they heerafter. wilbe more diligent in the exection of the oþer law and not to comitt the like offent at any tyme. **Herefore** doo hitting
consideracion to their humble submision and mynding to quylle and late the extremitie of the oþer penaltie and yet oþerwhare for example to payne the
said Justices and oþer. Officier. With þate of the oþer penaltie that shal be assynd in your appoynted fedelitie. Condone and disconion ther haue authorisid
assynd and apponited you and by these þentis to gyde unto you full power and authorite for us and in our name taling to you our Attorney Generall and with
his consent to componeid with att and oþer oþer of our said Justices of myt and oþer. her Officier to do or shal so yeld and comit them selfe to our clementie
as aforesaid. And whch noes are or shal be heerafter impeached in our. and Count of Chancery by þis euformacion or suggestion for acte conterming the oþer statute
or any brynghe or perte thereof. And of them and enemys of them to take and tare oþer leþable syue or fyndre to to vny. Condone and disconion by the
consent of our. oþer Attorney shalbe thought conuenient and upon payment mad to our. vse of oþer they. Generall forces to shalbe by vertue hereof assynd.
our. plentysse is that you shal be godes unto them and enemys of them oþer componeid cleere and quide discharge of att oþer matter. And offent touching the oþer
statute. Wherewith they or any of them by þis or euformacion in our. and Count of Chancery shalbe charged. Whch discharge being clysfid by you oþer be unto
them and enemys of them agynst us. our. heire and Successours and agynst all oþer. þis oþer discharge. a good and sufficient acquittall and discharge foreyn. Any laude or
tisoule ordre. communitement or matter. Whch be to the countesse. lord. bishope. And these þentis shalbe unto you for the doing of the þenysse sufficient witness
and discharge as well agynst us. our. heire and Successours as agynst all oþer. þis oþer discharge. **In witness** wherof we haue caused these our
her to be made patent. **Wytches** our. selfe. at Westmynster the six and twentieth daye of Januariye in the eight yere of our. reigne. **Siggen**
