Re: Report of gifts, grants and bequests  
received in October, 1969

During the month of October, the University of Chicago received from foundations, corporations, groups and individual donors, funds, or firm pledges of funds, in the amount of \$702,492.85. It is recommended that these gifts, grants bequests and pledges be accepted.

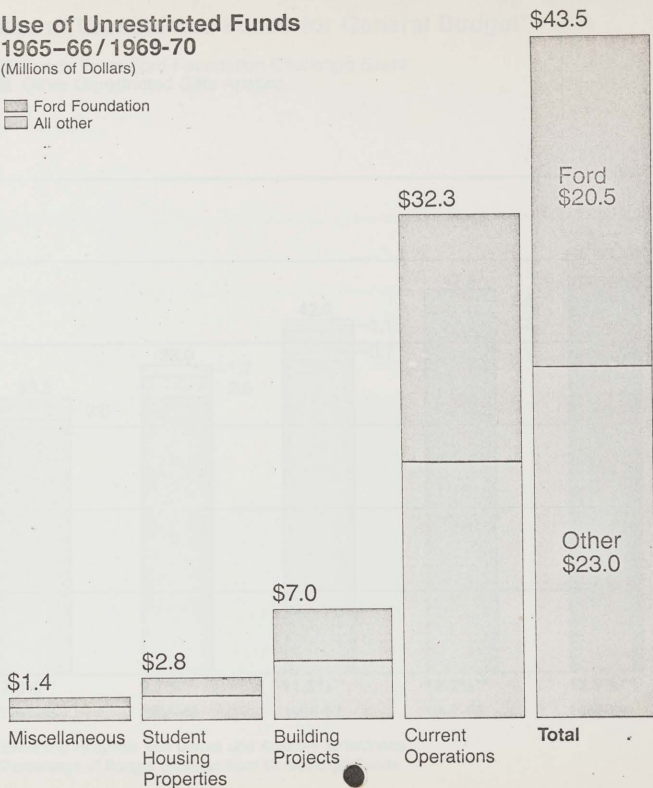

1965-66 / 1969-70

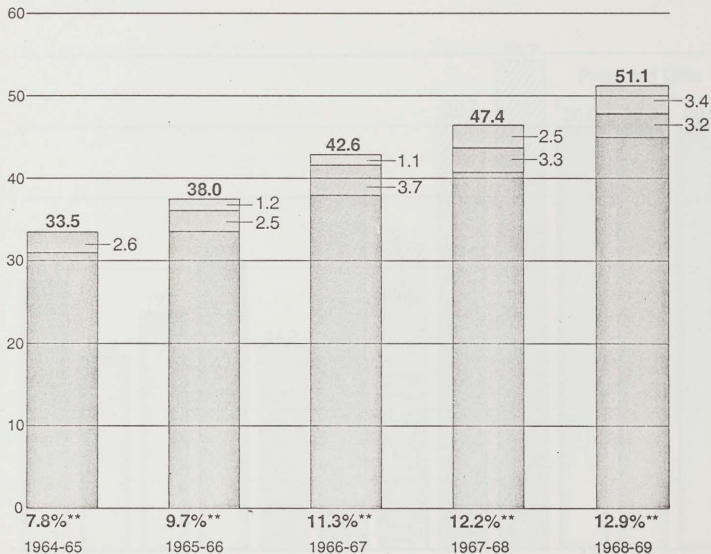

- Other Unrestricted Gifts Applied

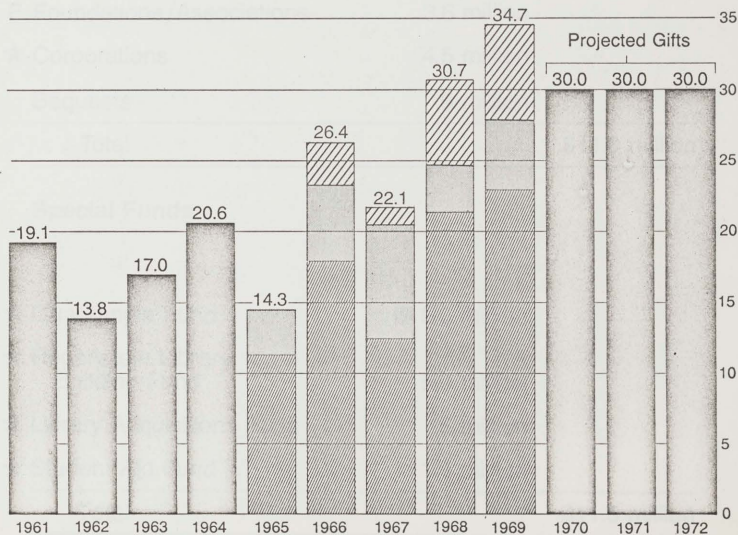

## Introduction

Three basic assumptions underlie The University of Chicago's development program for 1970, 1971 and 1972.

First, the University has gained impressive momentum in the years since 1965. It has achieved broader recognition and appreciation in the Chicago community and nationally. Awareness and concern on the part of the alumni have increased.

Second, the Campaign for Chicago demonstrated that the University has the capacity for fund-raising on a large scale.

Third, the period 1970 to 1972 represents the second phase of a ten-year fund-raising program that began in 1965 with the Campaign for Chicago. (An analysis of this three-year drive is included in this report.)

Two broad objectives should be kept in sight during the second phase:

First, the University must continue to seek large amounts of money, particularly unrestricted money, with the most vigorous and comprehensive effort possible.

Second, this fund-raising effort must be conducted in such a way as to position the University to move into the 1972-75 period with a realization among alumni and other supporters of the need to accelerate reaching the long-term objectives. It is apparent that the original ten-year goal of \$360,000,000 in gifts and grants, set in 1965, will be inadequate to meet the University's needs. By 1972, the University must have made a clear case for the option of conducting another broad, general campaign.

Both necessities and opportunities are changing rapidly. Attracting and holding top faculty has become more difficult in a highly competitive market. Costs are rising. Future support from governmental sources is uncertain. Critical needs that the University hoped to meet in the first half of the decade remain unrealized. These problems are clear to the University leadership. The President's Office is committed to concentrated efforts to solve them.

Under the stimulus of the Board of Trustees, strong volunteer leadership has been developed for a vigorous, continuing fund-raising program. The Trustee Development Committee has been formed to guide development policy and participate in the wide range of programs. Vigorous alumni, individual and corporate fund-raising efforts are underway. The four professional schools—Law, Medicine, School of Social Service Administration, and Business—are conducting their own annual alumni drives. In addition, faculty and deans have demonstrated a continuing commitment to the fund-raising program. (It is worth noting that faculty contributions during the Campaign came to slightly more than \$1 million.) In some respects, it is now easier to concentrate on major targets than it was four years ago.

The Campaign for Chicago can be characterized as a monolithic effort. While it contained a number of specific components, the major thrust was centralized and all volunteers worked toward the total goal.

A different structure is proposed in order to reach selected targets in the second phase.

- 1) Small working committees would be established for several of the principal objectives, such as the Library, Faculty Support, Student Aid and the Arts Complex. Each unit would work toward a specific fund-raising objective under the chairmanship of a member of the Board of Trustees, with one or more Trustees serving as the nucleus leadership. Additional volunteer manpower would be recruited from among alumni and other friends of the University. The several units would be coordinated by the Steering Committee.

- 2) The building needs of the Division of the Biological Sciences and the Pritzker School of Medicine would be organized as a distinct campaign program.

This approach will provide a change of pace from the Campaign for Chicago. It will focus our main efforts on attainable priority goals and establish a platform for the final phase of the ten-year development program. The objective of this program must be to sustain and strengthen an institution that plays a special role in higher education. The University of Chicago is different, primarily because of its intellectual qualities. This theme must be stressed and affirmed. Chicago gains special vigor from seeing itself as a great University with



a coherent, central purpose. Each unit is a part of a larger structure that has an extraordinary history of innovation and leadership.

The fund-raising program will be aimed at gaining further support for the entire University, seeking to provide the financial resources to continue the Chicago tradition.

## Specific Goals

The specific goals recommended for 1970-72 are:

### *I. Unrestricted Support*

The estimate of unrestricted support is based on the experience of the past several years and budget projections for the years ahead. These indicate that a minimum of \$7,500,000-a-year will be required. The sources of this unrestricted money would be as follows:

We propose to seek the remaining \$11.5 million through four special funds for the early 1970's.

- A. The Quadrangle Fund — to support faculty salaries and new appointments. \$5,000,000

The objective of the Quadrangle Fund will be to appeal to donors capable of giving \$10,000 or more a year or a minimum of \$30,000 over a three-year period. Max Palevsky's recent gift is an example of the kind of support to be sought. It is proposed that this program be given a name to dramatize its special purpose and to provide President Levi with ongoing relationships with donors of major unrestricted support for faculty purposes. A Committee of the Board should direct this effort, but the entire Board should play a major role.

- B. Regenstein Library Building Fund \$5,000,000

It is proposed that gifts totaling \$5,000,000 be sought to restore a portion of the unrestricted reserves which have been applied to completion of the Regenstein Library. A variety of important memorial opportunities are available in the building, and the Regenstein family has agreed to the University's establishment of memorials within the Library. The importance of this effort cannot be overemphasized. The University has worked for over a quarter of a century to build the Library. Its opening will be an event of

enormous significance in the life of the University. Every opportunity must be seized to stress this and focus our energies on raising funds to make the Library prosper. It is proposed that a committee be established for this purpose under the chairmanship of a member of the Board.

C. Library Acquisitions Fund \$ 500,000

The prominence of the new Regenstein Library at the University and in the national academic community suggests that new efforts be launched to seek substantial support for the extension of the University's collections. Book funds can be established on a term or endowed basis, and, in recognition of major gifts, collections within the Library could be named. It is proposed that the acquisitions program be combined with the Library Building Fund under the aegis of one strong committee.

D. Student Aid Fund \$1,000,000

A fund for Student Aid would seek annual and endowed support for fellowships and scholarships. Special opportunities may also exist to support the University's programs for minority-group students. It is proposed that a committee be

established under the chairmanship of a member  
of the Board.

## *II. Restricted Support*

The goal of \$10,000,000 annually in restricted support for the next three-year period is based on the experience of the past three years. During the Campaign for Chicago such support averaged \$9,981,000 annually from foundations, corporations, associations and from alumni and other individuals. Primary responsibility for restricted funds will rest with the faculty and administrative officers.

## *III. Priority Buildings*

The most urgent unfinished business of the Campaign for Chicago is student housing. Closely related are the plans to provide a better University environment—with the creation of the Woods-Cochrane Art Center, the Corinne Frada Pick Theatre and the Music Building.

There are other important needs still exclusive of those in the medical area, such as: a central facility for the Physical Sciences, the renovation of Rosenwald Hall and Business East for the Graduate School of Business, expanded athletic facilities, and the renovation of Harper Library and of several of the older dormitories.

For the next three years the University will conduct a vigorous effort to raise funds for the following priority projects:

It is recommended that a committee of the Trustees be established to concentrate on the completion of the Arts Center—the Pick Theatre, the Cochrane-Woods Art Center and the Music Building.

A similar committee would be established for the program of the Graduate School of Business.

However, it is recommended that the longer range objectives for student housing and for the Physical Sciences Center remain the concern of the Steering Committee and of the administrative officers for single, large-scale gifts.

Other physical plant needs will remain on the University's agenda and proposals will be submitted wherever and whenever they seem promising.

#### *IV. Endowed Professorships*

Every effort should be made to establish more endowed chairs. Experience indicates that this objective does not lend itself to concentrated campaigns comparable to the building funds. Increasing the endowment through the addition of 10 Distinguished Service Professorships at \$750,000 each and 10 Named Professorships at \$600,000 each should remain a priority concern of the Steering Committee. It is not proposed to establish a specific fund-raising committee for this purpose.

In addition to the traditional appeals, it is hoped that a program can be developed that would enable the University to name chairs in recognition of donors who make commitments to pay the full amount required within ten years or less. It is assumed in such instances that legal safeguards, including bequest provisions for unpaid amounts, can be established.



## The Biological Sciences and the Pritzker School of Medicine

The needs of the Division of the Biological Sciences, the Hospitals and Clinics and the Pritzker School of Medicine are so enormous that they sometimes tend to overshadow other University needs.

This is especially true with respect to buildings. Eight of 14 capital projects now in the working drawing or active planning stages are in the Biological Sciences.

Total cost of the eight projects was estimated on June 30 to be \$47,736,000—58 per cent of the cost of all 14. Money needed to complete the financing of these projects was estimated at \$40,887,000—more than was raised for all University buildings (including the Regenstein Library) during the Campaign for Chicago.

Even if only three of the most urgently needed Biological Sciences buildings—Research No. 1, Teaching and Surgery—are considered, the gift and grant need is \$30,561,000. Prospects for federal government grants for these buildings are unfavorable at present. It is hoped this will change, but if the buildings are to be constructed within the next two or three years, it appears that most funds will have to come from private sources. If this should prove to be true, gifts needed for the Biological Sciences alone would be nearly as much as all building money raised from non-government sources during the Campaign.

Added to the capital requirements is the fact that well over half of all funds for instruction and research in the 1969–70 budget are earmarked for the Division of the Biological Sciences.

A concentrated, separate campaign for The University of Chicago Medical Center—comprising the Pritzker School of Medicine, University Hospitals and Clinics and the basic Biological Sciences—should be undertaken as part of the overall effort.

This may be an excellent opportunity to capitalize on the special interest many individuals have in health care and the medical sciences. Experience suggests that constituencies attracted to Medicine and the Biological Sciences are different from those in other parts of

the University. The potential fund-raising leadership for this area often has considerably less interest in other parts of the University and the faculty is understandably partisan.

One problem during the Campaign for Chicago and since was the passiveness of the Medical Alumni. A fund-raising effort for the Medical Center, with all the trappings of a major campaign, well might excite their active interest, both in working and giving.

Results at other universities, especially Harvard, suggest that such sharply focused campaigns can be conducted successfully while other development programs proceed. Harvard has had two such campaigns—for the Medical School and the Science Center of Harvard College—within recent years while simultaneously pressing ahead on other aspects of fund-raising.

Corporate Support, President's Fund, Alumni Fund and other general development committees already are functioning. Committees to focus on several major building and program areas should be formed shortly. All can have their programs underway before the Medical Center Campaign would be announced.

We have discussed three-year goals for the over-all development program. The Medical Center Campaign logically should have longer-term goals—possibly four or five years. Announcement could be planned for the late spring of 1970.

## THE CAMPAIGN FOR CHICAGO 1965-1968: A REVIEW

## Highlights

The University of Chicago has proven its capability to raise large amounts of gift income from private sources.

The pre-Campaign assumption that individuals were the principal targets for substantially increased giving was correct.

Trustee gifts made the difference—both in setting the pace and in reaching the Campaign goals.

The special importance of gifts from individuals emphasized the indispensable role of fund-raising efforts by Trustees and high-level volunteers.

The drive for building funds met less than half the stated Campaign objective.

The level of annual giving by alumni was significantly increased during the Campaign years.

Support from foundations other than Ford declined during the Campaign years.

Corporations responded well—as predicted—to the Campaign appeal, but it is clear that annual support from corporations at levels achieved during the Campaign can be maintained only through relentless volunteer efforts.

Unrestricted giving has become more appealing—especially to alumni and corporations—than once seemed to be the case.

## Introduction

This report attempts to assess the Campaign for Chicago in two respects:

1. The results in relation to the goals and assumptions.
2. The changes that occurred in the sources of gifts, and the purposes toward which gifts were directed.

Since the Ford Foundation recognized gifts received from July 1965 for purposes of matching the Challenge Grant, the Campaign is regarded here as having embraced the period from July 1, 1965 through December 31, 1968.

At the end of 1968, cash gifts received had qualified for four-fifths of the Challenge Grant, making total receipts of the Campaign:

A number of donors who had been solicited during the Campaign did not respond until the first half of 1969. It therefore is appropriate to note that by June 30, 1969 gifts, grants, pledges and bequests received since July 1, 1965 had reached a total of \$174,784,000. The Challenge Grant was fully matched—a year ahead of the deadline.

The five-year term of the Challenge Grant set the pattern early in the Campaign for most corporate and many other donors, the result being that many sizeable pledges will not be fully paid until 1971 or later. At June 30, the total of outstanding pledges was \$42,200,000 as follows:

Among the outstanding pledges from individuals were \$4,486,000 from Trustees, \$10,993,000 from the Pritzker family and \$6,000,000 from the Regenstein family. The foundation figure included a balance of \$7,111,000 earned on the Challenge Grant but not payable until after September 1969.

A noteworthy circumstance of the Campaign was that total receipts (gifts and pledges, including amounts earned on the Challenge grant) reached two peaks—in the first and third years, as follows:

## Goals and Results

### *Broad Objectives*

The over-all goals of the Campaign for Chicago were: \$52,300,000 for program support, \$88,200,000 for buildings and \$19,500,000 in endowment.

Slightly more than two-thirds of the money raised was directly applicable to these goals. About one-fifth, including funds earned under the Ford Foundation Challenge Grant, was unrestricted and the remainder at December 31, 1968 awaited donor designation. Stated in this manner, the results compared to the goals as follows:

Raising \$118,000,000 in gifts, grants and pledges tended to become the central focus of the Campaign. That goal was reached in September 1968. At December 31, results compared with this statement of targets as follows:

The gift figure included \$30,986,000 for buildings—43.5% of the amount sought for this purpose.

Amounts raised against the various building components of the Campaign are shown in Table I. It should be kept in mind that the gift need listed in the first column of this table was based on cost estimates at the beginning of the Campaign. Actual cost of buildings completed or started during the Campaign period substantially exceeded the original estimates and current cost estimates on the remaining buildings now are higher still. The per cent of goal reached, therefore, is considerably overstated.

Still another statement of Campaign goals related to the amounts sought from five major sources of support. Amounts received, in relation to these goals, were as follows:

### *Size of Gifts*

A basic assumption at the beginning of the Campaign was that a relatively small number of gifts would provide most of the money raised. Experience bore this out.

To reach the \$160,000,000 goal, for example, it was estimated that 24 gifts of \$1,000,000 or more would be needed to provide a total of \$63,500,000 (Table II). Twenty-two gifts of this size were received—but they amounted to \$67,252,000.

The Campaign projection called for 140 gifts in the \$100,000–\$900,000 range to raise \$30,000,000. Although only 119 gifts in this range were received, they totaled \$35,429,000.

“Special Gifts”—those in the \$10,000–\$90,000 range—were 120 fewer than the projection and the amount raised was \$1,517,000 below the goal. Gifts under \$10,000 were \$1,240,000 less than projected.

## Changes in Support

In the foregoing section, the figures used were those prepared by the Development Office and included unpaid pledges and grants as well as cash received during the Campaign for Chicago. This data was assembled on a monthly basis and therefore was available by calendar years. While significant in measuring Campaign progress against stated goals, these reports are of less value in assessing changes in University support resulting from the Campaign—for the reason that pledges do not become support until paid.

To examine changes in support it is necessary to refer to the Comptroller's reports of "Gifts Received," which include only cash or its equivalent. These data are prepared on a fiscal year basis, July through June; it becomes necessary here, therefore, to regard the "Campaign period" as having embraced the fiscal years 1965-66 through 1968-69.

As noted above, the Development Office reported that gifts, grants, pledges and bequests received from July 1, 1965 through June 30, 1969 amounted to \$174,784,000. Over the same period, the Comptroller reported "gifts received" as follows:

The significant figure for examination is that for "other gifts." These, in part at least, were generated directly by Campaign activity. The sources from which they were received and the purposes for which they were given are pertinent to future fund-raising planning.

### *Sources of Support*

Comptroller's data show support from six major sources. When the Ford Challenge Grant is excluded, totals received between July 1, 1965 and June 30, 1969, and their relative importance, are as follows:

Since fund-raising efforts during the Campaign were directed principally at alumni, other individuals and corporations, it is interesting to note that this group contributed about 40% of the total.

The most spectacular gains, by far, were achieved by the alumni. The level of giving—including sizeable one-time gifts and Campaign pledges as well as annual support of the Alumni Fund and the President's Fund—nearly doubled year to year during the Campaign. In 1968–69, the alumni gift total was nearly seven times what it had been in 1964–65, the last year before the Campaign.

Gifts from other individuals increased on the average of 33.2% per year and in 1968–69 amounted to more than twice what they had been in 1964–65.

Corporate support in 1968–69 was 64.9% greater than four years earlier and gifts from associations were nearly double the 1964–65 figure.

By contrast, support from foundations (exclusive of the Challenge Grant) actually declined during the Campaign—a period in which total giving by American Foundations increased year to year. The total received by the University between July 1965 and June 1969 was \$28,201,000—20.8% less than had been received from all foundations in the preceeding four years.

In spite of its huge Challenge Grant commitment, the Ford Foundation increased its support during the Campaign—giving half of the amount received (Table V). (When the Challenge Grant is added, the proportion becomes nearly 70%.)

All other foundations gave a total of \$14,111,000 during the four years compared to \$22,882,000 between fiscal years 1962 and 1965. Grants from these in the peak Campaign year, 1967–68, were \$641,000 less than the *lowest* year in the four years preceeding the Campaign.

#### *Areas of Support*

The Comptroller's data show that over the four Campaign years unrestricted gifts (excluding the Challenge Grant) amounted to \$20,777,000—nearly one-fourth of all "other gift" income.

Corporations, alumni and other individuals, in that order, made the major contributions to this achievement. Results were:

Fifth-three per cent of all corporate gifts and nearly one-fifth of all association gifts were unrestricted. Alumni gave 32.1% of their gifts without restriction, other individuals 17.7%.

Gifts received for restricted purposes amounted to \$39,568,000 or about 35% of the total gifts received. Foundations provided 41% of these gifts and again the Ford Foundation provided nearly half. Associations provided 18.6% of the total, individuals 12.3%, corporations 11.3% and alumni 10.8%.

Two thirds of all endowment funds were received from foundations and through bequests. Alumni contributed 9.6% and other individuals 13%.

Non-alumni individuals gave 52.3% of all plant funds. Foundations accounted for 20.7% and associations 15.2%. Alumni gave only 4% of their total gifts for plant purposes and accounted for only 5.1% of the amount received.

Not surprisingly, however, alumni provided nearly 90% of all gifts received for annuities and living trusts—a total of \$3,900,000.

## Summary

The failure to meet the building funds goal requires study. It raises a question whether in the future the University must find a better approach—both in organization and in the nature of its appeal.

Declining support of this University by foundations at a time when foundation giving generally was rising also suggests a need for careful examination. Better means of stimulating and supporting applications for foundation grants are indicated.

Cold figures in a report do not, of course, tell the whole story about the tempo of a campaign. A few large gifts in any one year distort the picture. Assessing the reasons for upswings and downturns can become a highly subjective matter. Yet the year-to-year record of the Campaign should be examined to determine whether it provides guidance for future planning and organization.

No attempt has been made in this report to assess the Campaign organization. No one associated with the effort, however, could escape being impressed with the enormous contribution of the Trustees. Their own gifts accounted for more than a tenth of all gifts and pledges received, and many of them gave prodigiously of their time and energy in raising the rest.

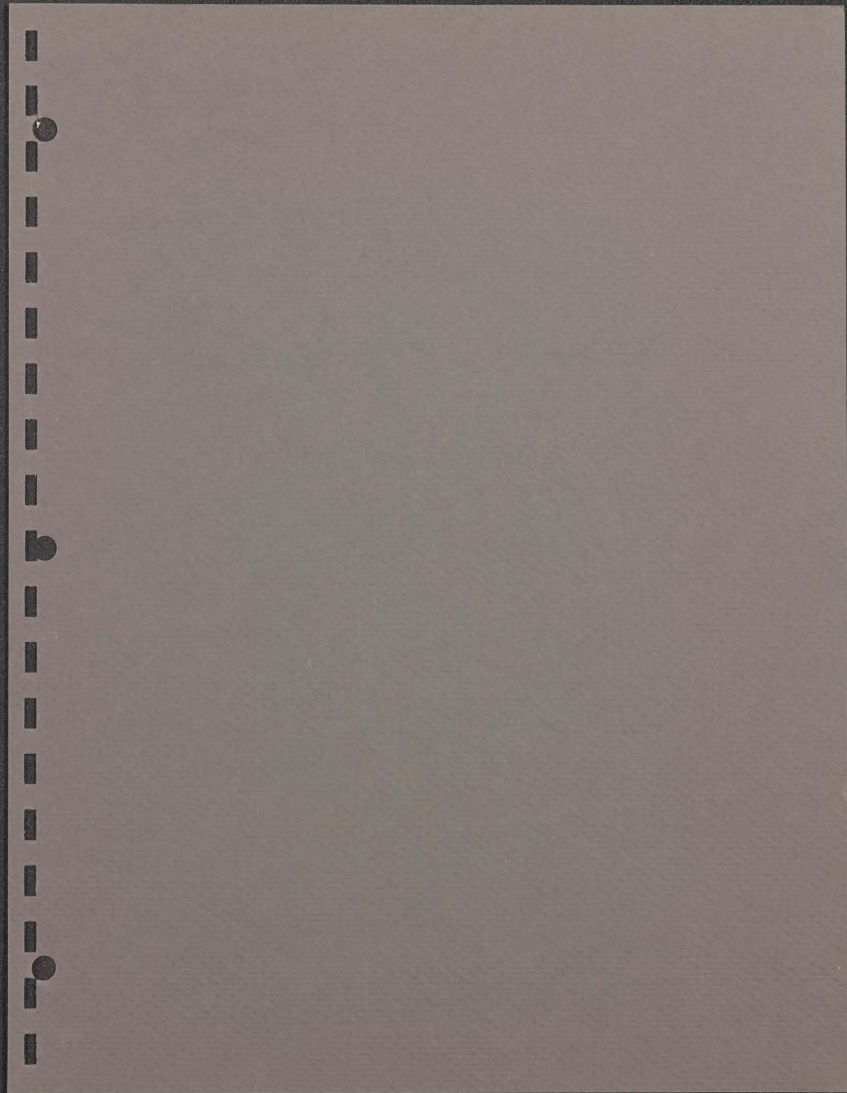

BOARD OF TRUSTEES

April 9, 1970

Pursuant to notice, a regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of The University of Chicago was held at the Board Room, One First National Plaza, Chicago, Illinois, on Thursday, April 9, 1970, at 2:00 p.m.

There were present: Mr. Cone, in the chair; Messrs. Charles Benton, Block, and Brooker; Dr. Coggeshall; Messrs. Dedmon, Donnelley, Douglass, Downs, Gunness, Gwinn, Irving Harris, Stanley Harris, Heineman, Kramer, Levi, Poole, Pritzker, Ranney, Regenstein, Stein, Stern, Ward, Watkins, and Woods; also Messrs. Axelson, William Benton, Douglas, Jarvis, Pick, Sherer, and Sulzberger; also Messrs. J. T. Wilson, Lee, Cannon, Claffey, Walker, Williams, Burridge, Bell and Leen.

The Chairman declared a quorum present.

An invocation was given by Mr. Sherer.

The Chairman referred to the luncheon meeting of the Board which had been held earlier that afternoon at the Board Room and noted that the speaker at luncheon was Mr. Robert McCormick Adams, Professor of Anthropology and of Near Eastern Languages and Civilizations and in the Oriental Institute, and, effective July 1, 1970, Dean of the Division of the Social Sciences.

The Officers of the University (other than the President, who is also a Trustee) were excused and the Board met in Executive Session.

Upon termination of the Executive Session, the Officers were invited to return, and the regular meeting was resumed. Thereupon, the Chairman announced that the following actions had been taken by the Board during its Executive Session:

- (1) The following were elected to membership of the Board of Trustees to serve for the terms of the classes indicated:

(2) On behalf of the Committee on Nominations, the Chairman reported that a letter had been received from Mr. John F. Merriam stating that it had become almost impossible for him to attend meetings of the Board and that under these circumstances he believed it advisable to resign as a Trustee.

Mr. Merriam's resignation was presented to the Board and was accepted with regret.

Subsequently, on motion made and seconded, by unanimous vote of all Trustees present at the meeting, Mr. Merriam was elected a Life Trustee of the University.

The Chairman introduced the new Trustees who were present, Messrs. Kingman Douglass and Irving B. Harris, and welcomed them to membership on the Board. The introduction was greeted with an enthusiastic round of applause.

At the Chairman's request, the Treasurer commented on a petition which had been received on February 19, 1970, from the University of Chicago Coalition to Stop Pollution Now. The form of petition is set forth below:

The Commonwealth Edison Company is one of Chicago's leading polluters.

The University of Chicago is one of Commonwealth Edison's largest stockholders and consumers.

We feel that it is neither desirable, nor indeed possible, for the University of Chicago to remain neutral in the battle now being waged by community groups in Chicago against Commonwealth Edison's polluting activities. It is not desirable because the well-being of the university community -- located in the worst pollution area in the city -- is directly at stake. It is not possible to remain neutral because once the battle has been joined -- as it has been -- choice between the Commonwealth Edison management and the anti-pollution forces is inescapable.

We, the undersigned, call on the University of Chicago to join with other community groups and educational institutions in combatting Commonwealth Edison's pollution of the environment:

1) By not assigning its proxies at the April 27 Commonwealth Edison stockholder's meeting to the company's management, but to the University of Chicago Coalition to Stop Pollution Now;

2) By joining in the city-wide campaign to pledge non-payment of electric bills -- putting the money in a trust fund until Commonwealth Edison has put forward an acceptable anti-pollution program.

The Treasurer reported that, contrary to the Coalition's understanding, the University within the past year had disposed of all shares of the common stock of the Commonwealth Edison Company held as endowment, that this action had been taken solely for investment reasons, and that the University presently held no Commonwealth Edison shares in any endowment fund or investment merger. He reported further that the University's only holdings of Commonwealth Edison were four thousand shares in a separately invested living trust fund, that this investment was providing a good yield at the time, that sale of these shares would have resulted in a loss for the trust fund, and that sale under these circumstances would have been inappropriate.

The Treasurer reported further that several members of the Investment Committee had met with representatives of the Coalition on March 25, 1970, to provide this group with an opportunity to present its point of view in support of the petition. In response to the Coalition's request for the Commonwealth Edison proxies at that time, the Chairman of the Investment Committee stated that his Committee wished to discuss the matter with other Committees of the Board of Trustees and, if necessary, with the full Board, before answering the petition.

Thereupon, the President reported that the matter had been discussed at the April 6, 1970, meeting of the Committee on Budget, and that, at the suggestion of that Committee, he had submitted the Coalition's petition to the Committee of the

Council and to the Council of the University Senate, to the Deans, and to the Departmental Chairmen with the advice that the Trustees would be pleased to have any observations on this matter which members of the faculty might wish to bring to their attention. The President reported further that the substance of the faculty view was that this matter was within the Trustees' jurisdiction, that it was not a faculty matter, and that their advice was limited to a strong expression of anxiety and concern about pollution generally and specifically about air pollution in the Hyde Park-Kenwood community.

Following full discussion of the issues, the consensus of which was that it would be a violation of their fiduciary responsibilities for the Trustees to accede to the requests in the Coalition's petition, the Chairman appointed an ad hoc committee consisting of himself and the President of the University to prepare a response from the Trustees which would decline the requests set forth in the petition and provide an appropriate explanation of the Trustees' views in this matter.

(For purposes of completing the record, a copy of the statement subsequently prepared by the above-mentioned committee and issued by the Chairman of the Board of Trustees on April 16, 1970, is appended to the official copy of these minutes.)

The President of the University presented the following proposal with respect to the 1970-1971 University operating budget, noted that the proposal had been reviewed and approved for presentation to the Board of Trustees by the Committee on Budget at its regular meeting on April 6, 1970, and commented thereon:

Re: 1970-1971 Proposed Budget

We request your approval of the 1970-71 University operating budget as shown in the accompanying booklet. Following are additional comments concerning this budget.

As shown on schedule I, the consolidated operating budget of the University totals \$151,467,000. This is an increase of \$11,966,968 over the 1969-70 budget of \$139,500,032 and \$15,070,000 over the 1968-69 actual of \$136,397,000.

In order to review the overall operations of the University, it is necessary to take into account expenditures made through restricted expendable funds. However, restricted expendable funds are self-budgeting in that expenditures are controlled by amounts specifically made available through gifts, grants, endowment income, and government contracts. Estimated expenditures from these restricted funds are \$49,819,000 (see II).

Excluding restricted funds, the University operating budget totals \$101,648,000 as follows (details are shown on II):

To balance this budget will require \$10,435,000 in unrestricted gifts (see I). This is \$1,110,000 or 11.9% over the 1969-70 adopted budget of \$9,327,000.

An accurate estimate of unrestricted funds to be received in 1970-71 is difficult to make because of uncertainties concerning all major sources. To give some perspective to the degree of risk involved in this budget, a summary is presented on the next page. The first column of this summary shows the expected actual results for 1969-70. The next column shows the 1970-71 budget as recommended. The last two columns show the range of possibilities for each major category of revenue. For purposes of this summary, operating expenditures are shown in the same amount for all alternatives. As indicated previously, the proposed operating budget requires \$10,435,000 in unrestricted gifts. In addition, a minimum of \$500,000 will probably be required for capital purposes. The total of these, or \$10,935,000, is about \$4,200,000 more than our recommended budget indicates is available. If these predictions are accurate, the shortage will have to come from the principal of funds functioning as endowment. The third column indicates a shortage of over \$9,500,000 which is probably too pessimistic, and the fourth some excess. The fourth column assumes unrestricted gift receipts of \$7,500,000 which is one-third of the goal set in the new three-year Development Program.

It is recommended that the attached consolidated budget for the fiscal year 1970-71 be adopted with the following specific actions as to financing and operations:

1. Authorize the use of a maximum of \$10,435,000 of unrestricted gifts to support the general funds operating expenditure budget for 1970-71 totalling \$53,135,000 and debt service subsidy on auxiliary enterprises of \$800,000.
2. Authorize the use of funds functioning as endowment in an amount not to exceed \$3,700,000 in the event that unrestricted gifts available are less than required.
3. Authorize restricted expendable fund expenditures to the extent that funds are available from balances on June 30, 1970, and from additions received during 1970-71. Estimated at \$49,819,000.
4. Authorize the President to increase the general funds budget under the following conditions-
  - a. by the additional cost of summer and other special programs, provided such additional costs are covered by at least a corresponding amount of additional income;
  - b. by the amount of proceeds from the sale of University-owned equipment when the President has determined that a department of the University is to be credited with the proceeds.
5. Authorize the President to revise the appropriation for hospital and clinics alterations and improvements by the amount of actual patient fee income over or under the budgeted amount.
6. Direct the President to reduce or eliminate expenditures when such action in his judgment is in the best interest of the University, it being understood that all feasible economies of expenditure will be made, and that such economies will be reflected in the final outcome of the budget and not used for projects not now contemplated in the budget without further reference to the Board.

(Copies of the 1970-71 Budget and Notes on the 1970-71 Academic Budget were before each member of the Board of Trustees. Copies of these documents are attached to the official copy of these minutes.)

The President emphasized that the proposed operating budget for 1970-1971 was a high risk budget in all respects and noted specifically that:

- (1) increases proposed for the academic budget were less than the general level of economic inflation over the past year, thereby jeopardizing the academic strength of the University;
- (2) limited increases in other parts of the budget constituted a risk to the maintenance of University facilities;
- (3) a very considerable risk was involved because of the magnitude of the projected deficit; and
- (4) there were inherent risks in the budget because of the uncertainties involving all major sources of revenue.

The President noted that the proposed budget represented the best judgment of the officers with respect to the appropriate risk to take in working to preserve the assets, including the intellectual assets, of the University.

At the President's request, the Comptroller commented generally on the contents of the tables set forth in the formal budget proposal which was before each of the Trustees. He also reviewed the line items in the special schedule on the second page of the President's budget letter and explained that the pessimistic and optimistic alternatives had been included because of the uncertainties with respect to all major categories of revenue. He indicated that the schedule demonstrated the University's need for unprecedented levels of unrestricted gift income, and noted that if the recommended budget was adopted by the Trustees and if the income estimates turned out to be accurate, then the budget would require the use of about \$4 million from the principal of funds now functioning as endowment.

The Provost then commented on the academic implications of the recommended budget and reviewed the highlights of the memorandum entitled "Notes on the 1970-71 Academic Budget," including a brief analysis of the influence of changing patterns of federal government support on University research and student aid programs. He noted the special significance of the Deans' Committee in the development of the proposed budget and in keeping all areas of the University generally informed about the financial situation.

Noting the prospective decrement in the percentage of support from federal sources and the practical limitations on continuing increments in tuition as a source of steady support for the general budget, the Provost emphasized the University's increasing dependence on unrestricted gifts for support of the academic program.

Referring to the distribution of the proposed budget across the academic areas, the Provost indicated that the general increment of 3% had not been applied equally to all areas, but as equitably as possible, taking into account the opportunity for support for certain areas, notably the Division of the Biological Sciences, from federal government and private foundation resources. He noted specifically that no increment had been recommended for the Library or the Computation Center, with the understanding that additional funds must be found outside the regular budget to support these operations.

In concluding his remarks, the Provost stated that the proposed budget must be regarded with cautious pessimism, but that this was offset by very positive developments in program leadership in several academic areas. He indicated that, despite the problems of the budget, a combination of other developments, including the opening of the new Regenstein Library, the move of the Bookstore, the renovation of space in Harper Memorial Library and other facilities for the College and the Division of the Humanities, improvements in the House System, and others suggested that the University could look forward to a challenging but rewarding year.

There was discussion with respect to the Provost's remarks. Partially in response to questions from the Trustees, the following additional information was presented:

(1) It was noted that in most areas the proposed budget for 1970-1971 was remarkably close to the Ford Profile projection for that year, with the exception of the College, which was \$800,000 or about 25% less than the profile projection. It was also noted that the enrollment in the College for 1970-1971 was about 1,000 students less than the Ford profile projection. The Provost explained that the lesser enrollment was principally a result of the University's inability to provide adequate new housing facilities for a larger enrollment. The Provost indicated that this reduced enrollment had been very beneficial for the College, both in terms of the opportunity this reduction had permitted for curriculum review by the faculty and also in terms of the stability and emotional well being of those students who were enrolled. He also stated that in his

judgment the College today was stronger than it had been a year ago. He noted that the balance between College enrollment and total enrollment was under continuing surveillance, and if new housing facilities for undergraduates became available, the extent to which an increase in College enrollment would affect the rest of the University would be carefully studied.

(2) In reference to the Provost's note that increments in faculty compensation in 1970-1971 would be generally minimal, a question was raised with respect to the impact this would have on the human resources of the University - and the University's ability to compete effectively for retention and recruitment of faculty. The Provost stated that the limited resources of the proposed budget would be utilized to preserve areas of strength, and that these would be made available to compete strongly for the best people in the strongest areas and also for very able young people at the entrance level in all areas. He indicated that even though increments for faculty compensation would be generally minimal, the University would continue to compete adequately in terms of retention and recruitment if the resources available were applied selectively.

The Vice-President for Business and Finance then commented on some of the implications of the proposed budget for the non-academic areas. He noted specifically that the general 3% increment as applied to the non-academic areas would certainly result in a clerical personnel squeeze since wage scales would have to be adjusted substantially in excess of this amount. He pointed out that in some high density clerical areas, staff size might actually be reduced. He also indicated that the 3% increment would force a modest reduction in the quality of plant maintenance service which could be provided, but noted that such reductions would be highly selective.

Senator Benton referred to a memorandum which had been prepared by President Levi when he was Provost several years ago, about 1962 or 1963, recounting the devastating impact of balanced budgets during the 1950's on the strength of several areas of the University. Senator Benton requested that the Secretary of the Board distribute copies of that memorandum to each of the Trustees who had joined the Board since that time.

The Treasurer commented on the investment income estimates in the recommended budget. He indicated that the reduction in estimated income reflected the fact that large cash reserves had been built up in the investment mergers during the current year and that a rising level of investment income had been obtained from these reserves as a result of rising interest rates. He noted that this was a non-recurring situation, that

some of these reserves had already been put back into equity investments, that short term interest rates were currently declining, and that, given the general economic situation, it was likely that some dividend reductions might be experienced to a minor extent during the year ahead.

The Vice-President for Development commented briefly on the development program for 1970-1972 and emphasized once again the increasing dependence of the University on unrestricted gift support for the academic program.

Following the foregoing discussion, on motion made and seconded,

IT WAS VOTED by the unanimous vote of all Trustees present at the meeting that the budget as presented at this meeting be adopted, and that each of the specific actions with respect to financing and operations as recommended by the President be approved.

The Vice-President for Development presented the following reports and commented thereon:

Re: Gifts, grants, and bequests: January - March, 1970

During the first three months of 1970, The University of Chicago received from foundations, corporations, groups, and individual donors, funds, or firm pledges of funds, in the amounts shown below:

January	\$1,615,975.85
February	1,067,748.26
March	1,597,929.59

Gift dockets for January and February, 1970 have previously been mailed to the Trustees. The gift docket for March will be mailed during the third week of April. Copies of these dockets will be appended to the original minutes of this meeting.

It is recommended that these gifts, grants, bequests, and pledges be accepted.

IT WAS VOTED that the various gifts, grants, pledges, and bequests as set forth in each of the above-mentioned reports be accepted.


In connection with the foregoing reports, the Vice-President for Development noted that the University had been emerging from the Campaign for Chicago for the past several months, and that the proposed development programs for 1970-1972 really couldn't be implemented during a period when substantial payments were being received on Campaign pledges. He noted further that the University was now in a position to move ahead vigorously with the post-Campaign development programs.

The President then commented briefly on the following problems for the information of the Trustees:

(1) He indicated that various federal government appropriation bills in different stages of the legislative process attempted to deal with the subject of campus disruption by tying that to government support for students and faculty research programs. He noted specifically that the Green Bill, which would impose upon the University the responsibility of certifying non-disruptive behavior, was of the type which the University could not live with if enacted.

(2) He indicated that the University continued to encounter difficulties in attempting to develop an equal employment opportunity program which would comply with all the standards set forth by H.E.W.'s regional Office for Civil Rights. He stated that it now appears that, to the extent that an adequate program requires a statement by the University with respect to the number of minority group faculty members to hold appointments in each academic department within a specified period of time, it might be impossible for the University to comply strictly with H.E.W.'s requirements.

## IMMEDIATE

Fairfax M. Cone, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of The University of Chicago, today issued the following statement:

The Trustees of The University of Chicago have received a petition asking that proxies on Commonwealth Edison stock not be assigned to the company's management but be given to a coalition, and that the University pledge non-payment of electric bills "until Commonwealth Edison has put forward an acceptable anti-pollution program".

The Trustees share with all responsible citizens a strong desire to reduce air pollution in our cities. The reduction of pollution requires the setting and enforcement of effective standards and the acceptance by enterprises and citizens of those costs which will have to be borne if these results of our industrialized society are to be mitigated. The University has acted to reduce the emission of pollutants from its own heating and power plants and will continue to participate in the improvement of its physical and social environment. Over the last three years the annual average and the highest monthly averages of amounts of sulphur dioxide in the University area have declined. Much remains to be done. There are other forms of pollution, and there is a serious problem of soot and soilage. New legislation, public interest, debate in which faculty and students have participated, and announced private plans should result in considerable progress.

In the view of the Trustees, the voting of stock in individual companies is rarely, if ever, an effective or appropriate method of discharging the University's institutional obligations to improve the cultural or social values or performance of our society. It is ineffective because the strength of the University is not based upon such financial holdings. In the language of a faculty committee report, the strength of the University is based on integrity and intellectual competence, upon the obligation of the University to provide a forum for the most searching and candid discussion of public issues, and upon its respect for free inquiry and diversity of viewpoints. In the exercise of this freedom, faculty and students have engaged in public discussion, studies, and the explication of views on social policy matters where it would be inappropriate, and could only curb dissent, if the Trustees or any other body in the University spoke for the University as a whole. The purpose of the endowment is to help the University preserve these qualities.

The specific requests to turn over proxies and to withhold the payment of bills, if accepted, would be a violation of trusteeship, but beyond this, in the opinion of the Trustees, measures which point in this direction would be self defeating and would weaken the institution in its paramount values.

Accordingly, the Trustees find it necessary to decline the requests in the petition.

## NOTES ON THE 1970-71 ACADEMIC BUDGET

These notes have been prepared for the purpose of helping you understand the University's academic budget for fiscal year 1970-71. They are presented in two parts: the first has to do with the development of the budget and the allocation of funds with reference to areas, etc.; the second has to do with prospective Federal Government support in fiscal year 1971 and its possible influence on the University's academic programs. We have tried to be brief. You may have questions that can be discussed at the time of the Board meeting.

### 1970-71 ACADEMIC BUDGET

Background - In anticipation of budgetary difficulties in 1970-71 Mr. Levi, last July, asked that a "Deans' Committee" be appointed "to make a survey of how we must approach this crisis." The Committee, chaired by Dean Davidson and having Deans Albert, Campbell, Jacobson and Johnson as members, began a series of meetings in early August. On the basis of discussions with staff members and with other Deans, the Committee made a number of recommendations regarding the 1970-71 academic budget, including:

"a 3% increase in the basic academic and business budgets of the University ..."

"a tuition increase for all students of \$225 per year (\$75 per quarter) ..."

"... the size of the faculty be limited to a number equal to or less than the number of faculty in 1969-70 ..."

"room and board charges for dormitories and single student housing ... be increased by 10% on the average ..."

"... appropriate adjustments in married student housing charges ... (be deferred) until a complete analysis of costs and revenues by individual properties be made."

The Committee, in company with other academic Deans, stated that they would "make every effort to achieve the projected enrollment figures used in constructing the budget."



The recommendations of the Deans' Committee were communicated campus-wide to the faculty and students by means of a series of memoranda. Following staff review of the Committee's recommendations and subsequent acceptance and approval by the President and the Budget Committee of the Board, the academic budget was prepared on the basis of 1) an approximate 3% total increment (applied not uniformly, but as equitably as possible across the various academic units); 2) an assumption that Quadrangle student enrollment would be approximately 8,300 (including some 300 students-at-large); and, 3) an assumption that the total number of faculty would not exceed in 1970-71 the total number of faculty this year.

Budget level - The level of the proposed academic budget, based upon the foregoing assumptions (not including student aid, the Industrial Relations Center, Pre-Collegiate Education and Hospitals and Clinics) is \$34,450,000. This figure compares to \$33,315,351 for the current fiscal year. The percentage increase is 3.41% overall; for the academic areas per se it is 3.01%. This increase compares to prior year increases as follows:

Faculty - As we have indicated, the budget assumes no increase in the total number of faculty in 1970-71. Changes in the composition of the faculty will be achieved by balancing acquisitions and losses across the University. Increments in faculty compensation have been generally minimal. In many instances, no increments have been budgeted. The current number of faculty, by rank and average faculty compensation in each area are as follows:

PROSPECTIVE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT SUPPORT FY 1971

Because of the influence of Federal Government support on the University's programs, the following brief analysis of the fiscal year 1971 Federal Government budget is of interest in relation to the University's 1970-71 academic budget. Research support is discussed first, followed by information on student support programs.

RESEARCH SUPPORT - GENERAL

The Federal Budget for fiscal year 1971 provides for increases over FY-1970 levels in total obligations and expenditures for research. Total support for development, however, will decrease, causing the combined R & D totals to decline. Increased support is requested for research and development at colleges and universities, but this is aimed at rather specific program goals.

Highlights include the following:

Obligations for research - up from \$5.5 billion to \$5.8 billion;

Expenditures for research - up from \$5.5 billion to \$5.6 billion;

Obligations for development - down from \$10.1 billion to \$9.4 billion;

Total Federal obligations for R & D, including facilities - down \$0.6 billion, from \$16.4 billion to \$15.8 billion;

Obligations for research and development at colleges and universities - up \$114 million, from \$1.418 billion to \$1.532 billion, but expenditures are up only \$26 million.

In FY 1971, budgeted additions are "targeted" for R & D related to the solution of pressing social problems including those of the environment, education, housing, transportation and crime. This is reflected especially in the budgets for the Departments of HEW, Interior, HUD, Transportation, Justice, and the Office of Economic Opportunity. New programs of the National Science Foundation emphasize research aimed at providing a better understanding of how to deal with environmental and other problems of society.

Obligations for research and development in colleges and universities, budgeted to increase by \$114 million, primarily reflect increases in support by the National Science Foundation and by HEW. These increases are claimed by Administration spokesmen to more than offset the decline in university research support by the Department of Defense, NASA and AEC. (The fraction of NSF support of research and development in academic institutions will rise from 14% of the total Federal effort in 1969 to 18% in 1971.)

The "programmatic" trends in the budget are not especially helpful to The University of Chicago, inasmuch as we accept support for research in areas of faculty, in contrast to areas of agency, interests. Agency interests as highlighted in the FY 1971 budget generally are not congruent with faculty interests at The University of Chicago.

#### RESEARCH SUPPORT - SPECIFIC AGENCIES

DOD - Planned DOD obligations and expenditures for research are higher in 1971 than in 1970 because of the mission needs of the Department. Obligations and estimated expenditures for defense development will be less in 1971 because of the completion of certain major defense systems. Because of the so-called "Mansfield Amendment" DOD relations with academic institutions are extremely confused. At best, support will be reduced. At worst, it will be zero.

NASA - The completion of the Apollo flights has led to a reduction in the total NASA budget. Major current activities are retained, including scientific exploration of the moon and launch of an experimental space station using Apollo systems. There will be a major increase in the funding for the Earth Resources Technology Satellite program, and a start on design and definition of a reusable space shuttle. The Laboratory for Astrophysics and Space Research (Simpson) will suffer from NASA reductions, as well as Air Force cutbacks.

NIH - Probable increases in biomedical research include: the National Cancer Institute where the budget will increase from \$173.7 million in 1970 to \$202.4 million, with an increase from \$30 million in 1970 to \$60 million earmarked for research related to viruses as a cause of cancer and research on the possibility of developing a vaccine or other measures to prevent cancers caused by viruses. Other NIH Institutes with expanding budgets are the National Heart and Lung Institute, the National Institute for Dental Research, the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development, and the new National Eye Institute and National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences. Total research and development for NIH is budgeted to increase from \$1,054 million in 1970 to \$1,136 million in 1971. Facility support is down. The Biological Sciences Division faces a "confused" situation. A lot of "juggling" of support will ensue.

NSF - The overall program level for the National Science Foundation increases from \$463 million in 1970 to a budgeted \$512 million for 1971. The \$49 million increase in program level presumably reflects in part the reduced resources of the Department of Defense for the support of basic research.

But, there will be shifting emphases in NSF. For example:

Increased support for the social sciences, including a significant involvement in the new program, Interdisciplinary Research Relevant to Problems of Our Society. (!!!)

Re-orientation of institutional support to more strongly recognize the need for problem-oriented research.

Initiation of "lead agency" responsibilities for the International Decade of Ocean Exploration. (!!!)

Beginning of "lead agency" responsibilities for the Arctic Research Program, including a major ecological study of the tundra.

Increased support for student-initiated, student-managed, and student-conducted research projects. (!!!)

Development of curricula for highly trained "technologists" at all levels, from two-year colleges through masters and other intermediate degrees short of the doctorate.

Significantly, Chicago will not benefit from the "programmatic" trends in NSF. Additionally, traditional NSF support will suffer, because it will probably take all year (if not longer) for the new directorate at NSF to settle down.

#### STUDENT SUPPORT

NSF - Specifics re NSF support of graduate students are as follows: The NSF traineeship program to support graduate students in the sciences is reduced but the fellowship program is continued at about the 1970 level (about 3,000 Fellowships). (House authorization action has restored traineeship program.)

As background, in the present fiscal year, i.e., 1970, NSF will grant about 940 summer awards (compared to 852 last year), and about 1,900 new traineeships for 9- or 12-month tenures (1,535 was last

year's figure). In addition, a total of 3,226 continuation traineeships, based on the numbers of new traineeships granted in fiscal years 1967, 1968, and 1969, will be awarded.

In fiscal year 1971, no new traineeships are budgeted for awards that would be available for the year beginning with the fall of 1971. However, the Foundation intends to honor all commitments for continuation traineeships. These will number approximately 3,300 tenable in 1971-72; 1,700 tenable in 1972-73; and 900 tenable in 1973-74.

No interruption in the annual award of summer traineeships for graduate teaching assistants is contemplated.

OE and others, graduate and undergraduate - Office of Education: Foreign language and area Centers support is down to \$6 million from \$20 million. This will hurt graduate student training programs very much. Title IV fellowships also have been reduced.

The Office of Education administers other student aid programs which mainly assist undergraduates. Three programs have been initiated to help increase the number of capable but economically disadvantaged students entering college:

Educational opportunity grants providing assistance for students of exceptional financial need;

Direct ("NDEA") loans providing low-interest, long-term repayment loans to needy students;

Work-study grants assisting students earning a portion of their college expenses through employment opportunities.

A Guaranteed Student Loan Program is available to students of all income levels. While the student is in school, the Government pays the interest on loans made by private lenders. After graduation the student pays the interest up to a maximum rate of 7%. A special allowance, currently 2½% of the principal amount of insured student loans, is paid to lenders when financial market conditions make such payments essential to achieve the purposes of the program.

The impact of modified OE programs for student support is not clear as yet.

The Veterans Administration will provide grants to 917 thousand returned and returning veterans at institutions of higher education. Outlays of \$397 million will be paid in 1971 under provisions of the Social Security Act to students who are the children, under age 22, of retired, deceased, or disabled beneficiaries. Finally, several Federal agencies offer fellowships and traineeships to support graduate, professional, and postdoctoral students in a variety of fields. A total of 118 thousand such students will be aided in 1971. What the impact of these programs will be is not clear.

memory of Homer J. Livingston:

Our colleague and friend, Homer J. Livingston, died  
on May 9, 1970, in his 67th year. The Trustees of  
The University of Chicago take this opportunity to  
praise this generous and able man and to record their  
profound sorrow on his passing.

Homer Livingston was born at Chicago on August 30, 1903. Following his graduation from the John Marshall Law School in 1924, he began an association with The First National Bank of Chicago which lasted throughout his business career. He became President of the Bank in 1950, Chief Executive Officer in 1955, and Chairman of its Board of Directors in 1960. In 1969, he retired from that position to become Chairman of the Bank's Executive Committee.

Homer Livingston's active association with The University of Chicago began with his appointment to the Citizens Board in 1947 and continued with his appointment to the Council on Medical and Biological Research in 1949. He was elected to the Board of Trustees in April, 1951. He was named a member of the Investment Committee in 1952, and gave especially valuable service to the University as Chairman of that Committee from 1956 until 1968. His sound business judgment, his professional counsel, and his constructive support were of enormous importance to the welfare of this University and have done much to ensure its strength and its future.

Homer Livingston was nationally known in banking, civic, and industrial circles. He was active in the American Bankers Association and served as its President in 1954 and 1955. He was a member of the Federal Advisory Council of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System and was President of the Council from 1959 through 1961. Throughout his years of business leadership, he served as Director of a number of major corporations, including Armour and Company, the Inland Steel Company, Sears, Roebuck and Company, and the Standard Oil Company (Indiana). In the community he rendered important service as a Trustee of the Chicago Boys Club and as a Director of the Chicago Central Area Committee.

The record of his personal and professional achievement speaks eloquently for itself. The University was especially fortunate to be a beneficiary of the vast range of experience from which he contributed frequently to solutions for so many of the troublesome problems of these times. We shall miss him greatly.

Mr. Chairman, I move that we express our affection, our sympathy, and our University's appreciation by a rising vote, and that copies of this Memorial be transmitted to the members of his family.

The foregoing Memorial was adopted by the Trustees standing in tribute, and the Secretary was instructed to send copies to the members of Mr. Livingston's family.

In beginning his remarks, the President of the University expressed appreciation to each of the Trustees for the understanding, guidance, and support which came from within the membership of the Board over the past year. He then discussed the present state of the University and reviewed in a general way a number of significant problems facing the University in the year ahead.

He noted particularly the difficult financial situation, the projected operating deficit for 1970-71, and the draw of nearly \$9 million from the principal of funds functioning as endowment. He also commented on the following items: the practical limitations on the level of future tuition increases; slightly declining enrollment in the graduate areas, especially in the Humanities Division; increasing enrollment of minority group students; prospective assistance from the Federal Government for the central support of the private universities; the urgent need for continuing central support from the private sector, especially foundations; the work of the Commission to Study the Economics of the University; current capital projects; financial problems with respect to proposed capital projects; the resident master system in the University Houses; neighborhood and community welfare and security, and the University's participation in a variety of programs in these areas; prospective problems in the neighborhood; pressures on the University from the Federal Government and others to employ larger numbers of women and members of minority groups; the proposed Afro-American Cultural Center; disruptive conduct by students and others; disciplinary problems and revised procedures; the increasing number of faculty involved in periods of excitement and disruption; increased political activity on campus; the change in the academic calendar for the Autumn Quarter; the action of the Council of the University Senate in passing a resolution condemning the presence of United States military forces in Cambodia; the tendency toward politicization of universities generally; a proposed commission to study the entire educational program at the University, including the length of time required for various degrees and the relationships between the professional schools, the graduate divisions, and the College.

In concluding his remarks, the President noted that the University had survived a very difficult year, that there were some scars, but that in many ways the University had come through this difficult period in a more reasonable and sober way than many other institutions.

The Provost of the University then reported generally on a number of matters involving the faculty and other academic affairs, including the following items: the appointment of several new Deans; changes in the pre-collegiate curriculum; faculty resignations, retentions, and new appointments in several of the academic areas; the relationship of the University's general medical resources to the delivery of health care in the sense of community medical programs; keen competition for faculty and the importance of competitive salary levels in the retention and recruitment of faculty; uncertainties with respect to Federal Government support programs upon which the science areas are especially dependent; and the Computation Center.

The Provost then presented a list of candidates for degrees to be conferred at the Spring Convocation to be held on June 12 and 13, 1970, and recommended that the degrees be conferred upon the candidates named, providing they conform to all requirements of the University for such degrees. A summary of the list follows:


