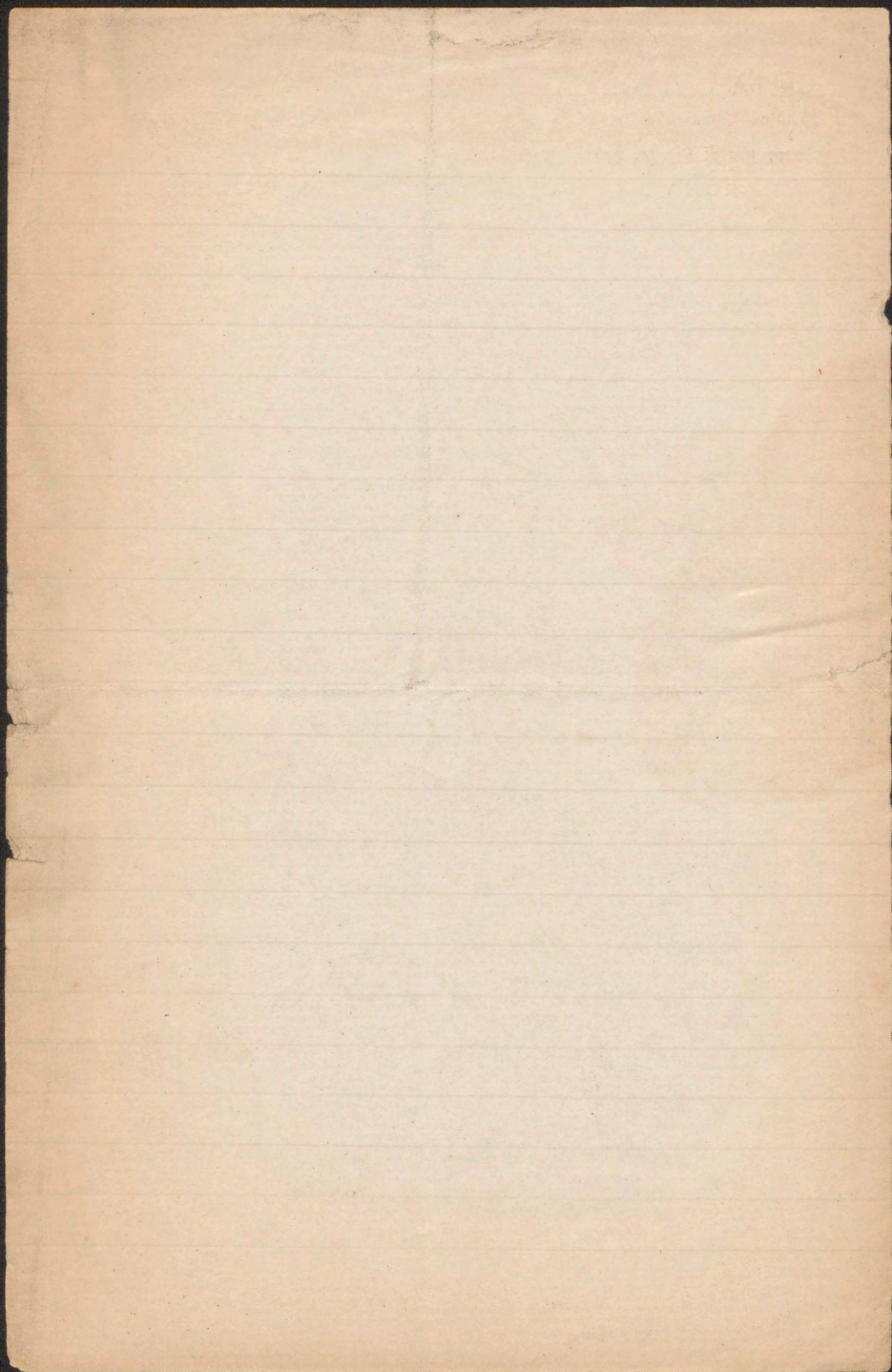

My dear Mr. Bunting,

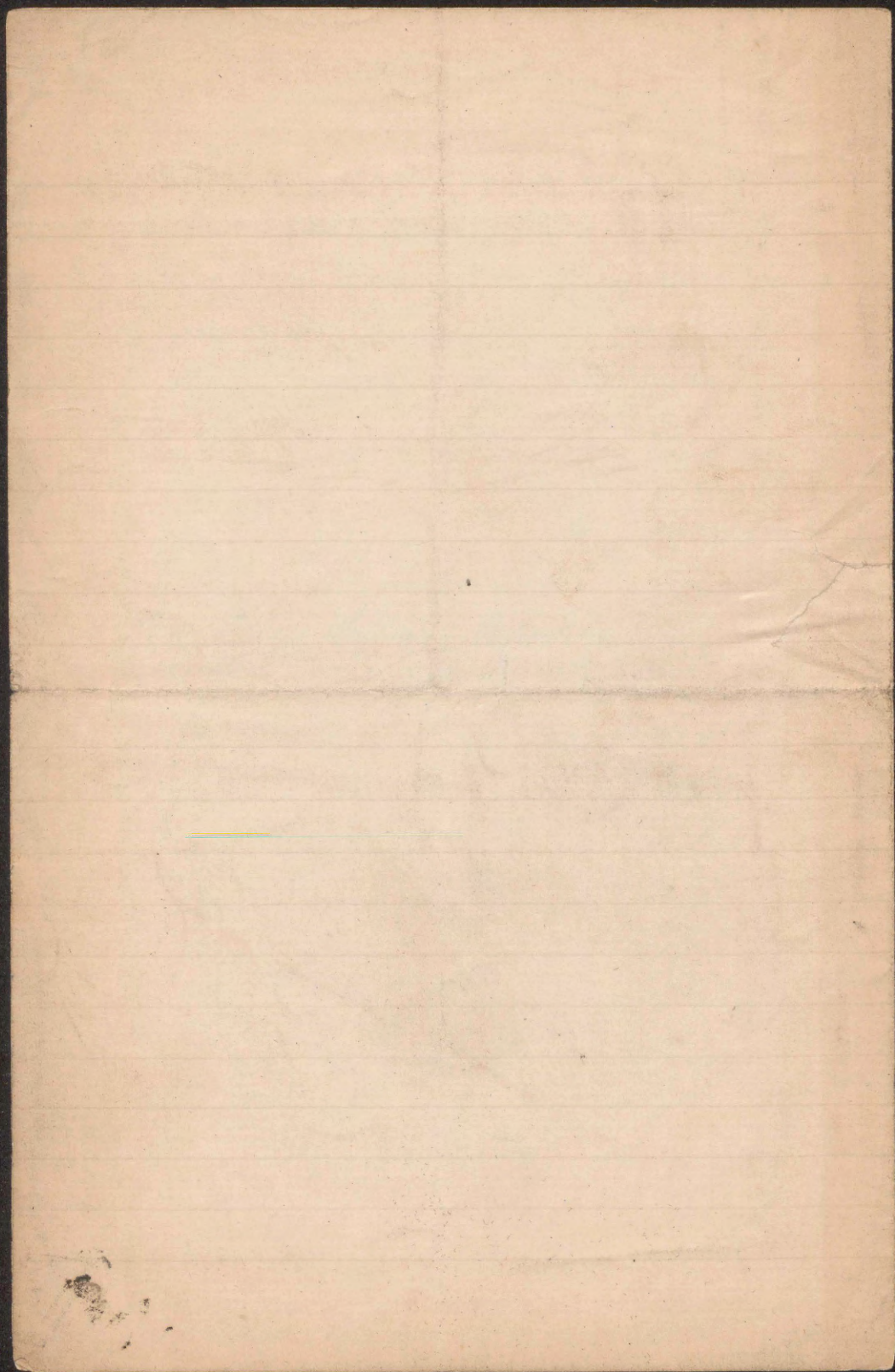
