DIRECTIONS for managing STRONG BEER, exported to America, &c.

It sometimes happens, that Strong Beer (tho' perfectly fine when bottled) by the effect the different climates it goes through has on it, throws up.

If this is the case when it arrives in North America, or the West-Indies, the purchaser will please unpack it, and set the bottles in any warm place on their bottom, and it will fine down in a few days.

The warmer the place be the better.——In cold climates, Strong Beer will always throw up; and therefore should be kept in warm cellars.

From South Carolina to the Northward, all Strong Beer must be kept in cellars, during the Winter, where no Frost can enter.—From that to the Southward, the Beer needs no management, further than the natural heat of the climate.
