Our Will & Pleasure is, that out of such Monies as are in or shall come to your hands for the Contingent uses of Our Land Forces, or out of such Monies as are in or shall come to your hands for this use, you pay unto John Charleton Esq^r Agent to the Inspector General of Regimental Infirmaries, the Sum of Two thousand Pounds, without deduction, on account, to enable him to make such payments as may from time to time be directed by Our Secretary at War, for sundry Contingent Disbursements for Hospitals &c. And for so doing, this, with the acquittance of the said John Charleton Esq^r or of his Assign, shall be your Warrant & discharge. Given at Our Court at St. James's this 18th day of Novemb^r 1789, in the thirtieth year of Our Reign.
