Dear Sir

I wrote you the 14th by Capt. Good, by whom I have sent the goods you wanted from this Store, also those for Mr. Munday. — Yours of the 15 and 16th by post, I have duly received with copy of the one sent by Mr. Hood, which is not yet come to hand. —

I am really very uneasy about the blunder in the Dumps and Boan Store accounts on 30th Sept. 1787, and will be careful that none such shall happen in future, I shall correct and make the entries agreeable to the acc. you sent me.

Mr. Somers is uneasy for fear of his not getting the money promised him in time, he spoke to me on Tuesday last, and begged I would write you to let him have it if possible next week at our bank, which he would have the Job. ready for me.

Capt. Carbery was with me on Sunday last, and says the Sloop will be complicated by the beginning of next week, and wants to know if he is to go immediately with her to Dumps, and also whether he must get a new Register and at what office — The day was appointed for him and his

his wife to meet at the head of Clements Bay to execute the
Deeds to you and Mr Bryde, proved rainy, so that neither the
Magistrate nor I met him, we have appointed one day
this week to do the business.

In regard to what you write me concerning Mr Bond's
Lands in this County, please know, that he has two tracts, one
lying in the neck about two miles below me, containing abt
250 acres of flat level land and would sell on giving a bid
for £600 at least, the other, the road between the head of Clem-
Bay and Leonard Town 600 acres and would sell for £400.

When Mr Bond comes down in the spring, I will know of
him whether he intends to buy of Mr Henderson and sell his
here and conduct myself in the business as you wish.

The Gentlemen at Camp Lach-fah wrote me that I should be
plentifully supplied with rum sugar & molasses, in consequence
of which and my speaking of it, the Puro's broke up their work
store at this place, since which I have not heard any thing
more about the matter, further than receiving 4 lb of molasses
from Mather - If any is intended for this store, please let me know
and what it may be expected.

I have at 100 Lbs Tob and expect
this week to get in 100 more
exclusive of Somerville, if the fall in
price does not prevent it.
