

Philadelphia April 6. 1793.

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Sir

After much search and enquiry I have obtained the original letter from the Commissioners of the Federal Court at Trenton relative to the disputed land at Wyoming. I requested Mr. Dickinson, if the letter were in his possession, to transmit it to me, or to any person he thought proper, so that it might be obtained, if needed.
