Whereas it appears that most of the provisions of said bill are practically the same as the provisions of the present Civil Service Act in force in the City of Chicago, the principal change beinf in the provision in regard to removals, which remains practically the same as the opposent removal clause in force in the County Service and which has worked satisfactorily under the present administration, now therefore be in

Resolved that this organization endorses the action of said Conference Committee and approves the bill as drafted with the exception of the removal clause, and agrees to co-operate with the County authorities and other organizations interested in Civil Service to secure the passage of said bill, with the removal clause suitably amended, at the present session of the Legislature.
