THE ORIGIN OF COINS

It is generally agreed that the first silver and gold coins were made about 900 years before the Christian Era. The credit of inventing money, which could be simply counted and not weighed, has been claimed in Europe for the inhabitants of the Island of Aegina, off the coast of Greece. In Asia, the credit is claimed for the Lydians, a people of Asia Minor.

These early coins were of crude workmanship, being little more than pieces of silver or gold of a certain weight driven by a strong punch or hammer into a mold or die so that on one side was the design and on the other the indent of the punch.

These crude coins established a more convenient medium of exchange which was to become the money of civilization.
