The Library of International Relations was established in the fall of 1932 under the auspices of the Mid-West League of Nations Association. Located in the John Crerar Library Building in the center of Chicago it is easily accessible to the students, teachers and lecturers who wish correlated information on international affairs.

The Library has been built around the historical, political, social and economic aspects of present day world relations. A wide selection of books by outstanding authorities on these subjects, the official documents of the League of Nations, the World Court, and the International Labor Office are to be found here. Periodicals issued by such organizations as the Foreign Policy Association, the Institute of Pacific Relations, and the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace, as well as a complete press clipping file emphasize current international events.

This is the only library in the city dealing exclusively with international relations. All the work is on a volunteer basis and the splendid growth is due entirely to interested and generous donors. Any material which will help the Library to offer more accurate information on international subjects is most welcome.

The Library of International Relations appreciates deeply the vision and generosity of the John Crerar Library in providing the space for the new collection.

### Foreword

The Story Cove is the nucleus of a children's international library of picture books and story books in the original language or in translation. The collection includes factual material of both historic and contemporary times, reference works, and stories of other lands by English and American writers.

In this world of unchosen neighbors where existence itself demands we live with and through one another, it is the better part of valor to realize our mutual necessity as well as our mutual differences. Sympathy can bring appreciation and richness to the enforced relationship; ignorance and misunderstanding can bring only disaster.

It is our children who must face the problems of tomorrow. An open mind and an understanding heart are the best we can hope for them,—understanding of life however it is expressed and by whatever peoples.

In the treasures of literature and art offered by each land to its own child world lies the true spirit of the people. Here are no issues, prejudices, controversies, no need for explaining, defending, each land simply expresses itself to its children for their amusement and happiness. The same picture books, animal and fairy tales are loved by children everywhere. All nations understand one another as they move without masks in this child world. Mother Goose is a familiar character even in far off China.

We take this for granted. But should we? Even before the invention of the printing press stories of one people were known to others at great distances, but as the stories were told over and over again from generation to generation they were absorbed into the lore of that people and little thought was given to the tales as the expression of the life or ideals of another people. How often do we think of Andersen's fairy tales in their rightful background—a Danish mind interpreting life in his country through the medium of a delightful imagination? The dress, the houses, the very scenery are found in truth in that small country to the north.

In the Story Cove we have tried to make vivid and distinct these qualities we are so apt to take for granted, so apt to think of as "just a fairy story." We have added books and stories about children of today, of their homes and their toys, their ways of life and thought. In our story hours we have told old legends and tales of today, we have celebrated the several national holidays, have asked the foreign consuls to tell of children in their own lands, have asked children from these countries to come in their national dress, to give their own particular dances or songs, we have hung their flag next to ours, and have put lovely scenic posters on the walls, we have put tiny flag bookmarks in the stories of their country in the books on the shelves. All this has brought appreciation of the reality of a country which has been only a name, of a language which has been only a grammar lesson.

Well-known authors who have travelled far and wide have told the children of their journeys and have proved in themselves the richness of the spirit that explores the unknown with sympathy and intelligence. The books of the Story Cove will remain a permanent invitation to such exploration. As the children's section of the Library of International Relations they will grow in numbers and in use. May a friendly feeling between children of all countries be engendered by such libraries as this!
