The Expense

All of this wonderful work has cost the patient nothing more than holding an ordinary Beneficial membership in a genuine fraternal Society. No extra charge is ever made for this valuable service which includes food and lodging. Nobody is ever permitted to pay for it even though thousands of dollars may be required to supply the needs of a single patient.

In all parts of America we find one or more of the eleven thousand happy homes in which a life has been saved by this matchless service. reports to the Sanatorium in order that further advice and assistance may be given when needed.

Any member of the Society who holds and keeps in force a proper certificate may be eligible to become a patient in the Sanatorium







under the rules governing admissions. All Beneficial members who carry insurance in the Society, including Juniors, are entitled to this service. Other adults may receive the same benefits by securing a special Sanatorium Service Membership certificate at a very low cost. Members may transfer from one class to another if found eligible under the rules.

Sanatorium Service Certificate

Special Form SS membership certificate is issued to acceptable white men or women over 16 years of age and entitles them to all rights and benefits granted to Social members with free Sanatorium service in addition thereto. The total cost is \$4 adoption fee, \$1 certificate fee, and 50 cents per month dues payable to the local Camp.

Sanatorium Service and Savings Certificate

Special Form SSS membership certificate is issued to acceptable white men and women between 16 and 60 years of age and entitles them to all rights of a Beneficial member including free Sanatorium service. The cost of joining is \$5 adoption fee. The member is then required to save and deposit the sum of \$1,

\$1.25, or \$1.50 (according to entry age) each month with the local Camp for a period of 15 years, and all such monthly payments are returned to the beneficiary by the Head Camp when the member dies. After fifteen years the Form SSS certificate and all its benefits are paid up for life and no further payments are required.


