

I also saw 2 sailors sitting at tables and 2 soldiers in uniform dancing. I could not see what the sailors were drinking nor where the soldiers were sitting. We left the Fountain Inn at about 11<sup>40</sup> P.M.

Inv. U, X and V. O. Whitsker walked up and down Halsted St. and later met Inv. R and R. D. McGarrah (a sailor) at 63<sup>rd</sup> & Halsted St. where we stood until about 1 A.M. (Sunday, April 14<sup>th</sup> 1918). We all walked north in Halsted St. about  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile and left the vicinity.

The barker repeatedly hollered out loud enough so that it could be heard out in the street, "Come on boys, alright boys, see the girls upstairs. Stairs over here." (Pointing to stairs which lead to the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor.)

The four of us proceeded upstairs and at the door on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor girls garbed in kimonos and thin pantaloons through

which their bare limbs were visible and in some instances exposed their privates.

This place was crowded with men. As we entered a girl grabbed each of us by the arm and led us to a table in the front part of the 2nd floor. Each of the four girls asked us to buy drinks and I noticed a waiter standing by. We were served with 8 glasses of beer for which Inv. R paid \$1.00 plus a 10¢ tip to the waiter.

When the beer was served the waiter distributed a metal check to each of the girls sitting at our table.

The girl who sat with me said her name was "Della". I asked Della what the checks were for and she said that they represented her commission on the sale of the beer. When Della placed the check in her stocking she showed me a bunch of checks (about 50) which she said she had made so far to-night.

This place was crowded and it was about 5 minutes before the waiters found a table for us. We were then ushered to a table in the rear of the room next to the orchestra. There was approximately 225 people sitting at tables and about 20 people standing near the door waiting for a table.

The orchestra here is of the original jazz type and 3 girls entertainers were garbed in low necked dresses.

When the orchestra played for a dance the small dancing space could not accommodate the people who tried to dance and as a result, the couples in general just stood practically still rubbing their bodies together. I also saw men grab other women with their hands and pull up and down their legs. The dances

could not commit more illicit acts with one another and at the same time stand up.

"Shimmy" dancing was popular.

I saw many men and women intoxicated and some of them trying to dance were hardly able to stand.

I saw several boys and girls sitting at different tables who appeared to be about 18 years old, some of whom were intoxicated.

It was nothing unusual to see men and women caress and embrace each other in here.

The 3 women entertainers mingled with the patrons while they were not singing and solicited them to buy drinks. Two of these women came to a table next to ours and succeeded in having the men here buy them drinks.

 Entering thru the bar on the 1<sup>st</sup> floor we

In the front of the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor were bedrooms about 14 in all. In the rear room (which is the receiving room I counted 10 tables, 28 men and two waiters.

All the girls were garbed in kilimanas or pantaloons slit in front.

I saw a woman who appeared to be the Madam, standing in front of the hall that leads to the bedrooms. A girl and a man who disappeared down this hall stopped and gave the Madam money in bills and the girl in turn received a metal check.

I saw in many instances these girls expose their bare-limbs and in one instance one girl sitting with 2 men at another table deliberately exposed her "privates."

My Dear Mr. Thresher:

I hereby tender my resignation as an investigator for the Committee of Fifteen and regret to state that the conduct of our chief investigator, Mr. William Goldkirsch is so unbearable that I cannot stand it longer.

On May 15<sup>th</sup> 1918 Mr. Goldkirsch held a girl of immoral character on his lap whom we picked up on the road north of Burnham and continued to hug and kiss this girl from the time we picked her up until our arrival at 56 W Madison St. Chicago.

This happened in the presence of Mrs. Pollard and Capt. Beckwith, both government officials and our guests and each made remarks upon our arrival in Chicago to impress me that they were acquainted with Mr. Goldkirsch.

It was necessary for me to apologize to these two government officials in behalf of the Committee of Fifteen.

Mr. Goldhirst is also in the habit of removing his coat in a pool room while playing pool exposing a revolver hanging from his belt, which drew considerable attention from other pool players. The first time I noticed this was about four weeks ago at 14 N. Clark St.

Mr. Goldhirst also told me that two brother-in-laws on the job were dangerous. When I asked him, "why," he replied that if Inv. X or myself done anything crooked, one would shield the other.

I could mention numerous other reasons why I am resigning, all of which pertain to Mr. Goldhirst's ignorance, ill-manners, domineering and sarcastic ways and talk and I can bear it no longer.

I trust that the Committee will help me in securing another position which I will greatly appreciate because of resigning without a position in sight - Yours Respectfully

After being seated at a table in the south-west room I ordered and was served a bottle of lager beer for which I paid 25¢ plus a 10¢ tip to the waiter.

The beer was brought in and poured from a dark brown bottle which bore no label, into a tall glass. The waiter carried the bottle away after emptying it. There were about 75 people present, 2 musicians and two female entertainers. The majority of the patrons were drinking beer served in the same manner as was mine. Some were served <sup>an</sup> amber-colored liquor which appeared to me to be a gingerale or balls.

I also saw a man of Jewish descent, 5 ft 5, 125 lbs, and dark complexioned, acting as manager.

I inquired of the young woman at the door who checks the coats and

hats how long she worked. She told me that this place stays open as late as 3 and 4 a.m. It all depends on the crowd they have. I asked if we could purchase drinks up to that hour on saturday (Sunday a.m.) and she said "Yes"; I did not see Louie Weiss this visit.

I entered again at 12<sup>55</sup> a.m. and found a seat in the southwest room about 15 feet from where Louie Weiss was seated at a table. Louie Weiss looked at me but showed no indication of recognizing me as one of his enemies. I ordered and was served another bottle of lager beer for which I paid 75¢ plus a 10¢ tip to the waiter.

This bottle of beer was served in the same manner as the above bottle. I saw Govt X served with a bottle of liquor in the same manner.
