Wednesday January 9th 1918

By an appointment made over the telephone by Mrs Burgdorf, I met Sam at the Hotel Laballe at 3³⁰ P M. (Inv. X Covered both of us)

I spent 20 minutes with Sam at the hotel bar, where we had a glass of beer each, and in that time told me, that, Smiley had hired him to go to Minneapolis to work on a job he had worked on before, and that when he got back that Smiley had guaranteed him steady work. That Smiley told him that the C. of F. had 2 negro men one of which had a lantern jaw, & about 145 lbs, and the description given of the other man was correct, because he (Sam) had seen him. Also that Syd was going to be fired this coming Saturday.

That Smiley also told him
 (over)

that on account of that dirty
little Jew — — he (Smiley) has
lost lots of the C. of F. business.

Sam said that he was going
to write Mr Thrasher a 3 or 4 page
letter telling him just what he

 and Streeter continued the search but
 did not find any other liquor.

I noticed on the kitchen sink
 2 empty whiskey flasks, and about

Kilcours then marked in pencil the labels of several bottles of both the full cases of beer, also on the side of the cases.

Streete then read a warrant to Matilda Durant, and took her away with him.

Keough and myself carried the two full cases of beer down to the automobile, and in company with Kilcours drove back to the Federal Bldg.

We placed the cases in a vault after Keough and myself marked several bottles, and labelled the cases (the vault is in room 531)



Just as we were being seated I noticed 2 uniformed policemen leave the service bar room and walk out. I could not get their numbers.

We then ordered the above specified drinks in the order + paying the amounts as shown.

Of the 4 Beers served to Inv. V. I saw him confiscate a portion of each one, transferring same into a bottle. I tasted his first beer + it tasted like real beer.

I confiscated portions of the three highballs served to me, transferring same into a bottle. From the taste of each I would say they contained whiskey.

We were solicited to buy all drinks served to us by colored waiter No 8., except the first 2 beers which were served by colored waiter No 3. and except the round of drinks which I paid for served at the other table of our party + except for the two bottles of gingerale highballs which we took out with us.

As we finished our lunch I called over a man who seemed to be in

charge and whom I heard call a man by the name of "Louie". (Louie is about 40 years old, 5 ft 9 inch, 170 lbs, Blue eyes, bald, Jewish appearance.) I asked him if he was the manager and he said yes and that his name was Harry De Witt. After our talk he said that he would see that I would be treated right.

Waiter No 3 solicited us to buy drinks. We ordered 2 beers. No 3 said that they could only serve Bevo, but that we would it to be alright. We were served (Inw. V. and myself) from 2 brown bottles, without labels, same being poured into tall glasses.

It tasted like real beer. Harry De Witt then came over and said "real stuff isn't it". Waiter No 3 then came over and I heard him say to Inw. V. "that that is real beer"

Miss Mc Namara + I danced three dances. The dance floor covers parts of the three rooms. As we danced I counted 40 people present. Most of

the drinks on the tables appeared to be gingival Nightballs. I noticed 2 drinks which appeared to be "sloe gin fizzes" and 3 drinks served in small wine glasses which looked like port wine. I did not notice any beer.

Amongst the dancers & couples danced in a very suggestive way, one couple of whom would kiss each other when they arrived in the north room.

One of the girl entertainers as she sang each song went thru the motions of a "belly dancer".

Mr Weston came over to me and said his friend Miss Betty De Foe wanted a dance with Mr. Walter No 3 heard him, and I said to Walter No 3 that that was against the law & that I had better not dance. He told me he knew it was but for me to go ahead that he would speak to Louie & fix it up. I then danced

with Miss "Kitty" De Foe.

Louise Weiss was very active receiving people as they came in, going back and forth to the service bar room and setting at different tables.

Harry De Witt came over to me a number of times, asking if I liked the service and the drinks. He said if I didn't get what I wanted to let him know. I told him that the highballs which I was drinking had enough whiskey to kill a horse, & he said that was the only kind they sold, and that any time I wanted to get fixed up to come & see him.

He asked me if the party at the other table (pointing to Miss Kelly De Foe table) were alright & I said sure give them all the booze they wanted because they are friends of mine & he said alright whatever you say goes.

at about 11¹⁵ P.M. Miss Kelly De Foe party left.
