How old is it?

Founded in 1840.

Is it incorporated?

Yes under the laws of the State of

Who are its members? All who contribute to it.

Where is its headquarters? At 35 E. Wacker Drive, Chicago, Ill.

How is it governed?

By a Board of Managers and Officers usually elected in such an organization.

When does the Board meet?

Once each year, in January, to receive reports from Officers, elect Officers for the ensuing year, and conduct such business as may come before it.

How is the business of the Society conducted at other times?

By the Secretary under the direction of the Executive Committee.

How is it supported?

By contributions, by income from sales, and by legacies.

What is its policy for distribution of the Scriptures?

Sells Missionary Editions of the Scriptures at cost.

Supplies Churches and workers at lowest rates possible.

Makes gifts where needed and possible.

Where does it function?

In Churches, Sunday Schools, Hospitals, Jails, Old Folks' Homes, Orphans' Homes, Sanitariums, Asylums, Missions and individual workers supplied.

Does it need more support?

YES. Especially just now, the needs are far beyond the meager funds of the Society to supply.

Last year, 1932, it circulated—

17,234 Bibles,

21,725 Testaments, and 81,747 Portions,

120,706 Volumes in all.

Total value of \$22,577.96

Scriptures circulated in 60 different languages.

Bible Programs and Addresses were given in many Churches.

35 Churches were helped to secure much needed Bibles.

40,000 Gospels were given to Mission Workers. As many more were needed.

1,000 Testaments were given to Hine Memorial Hospital. 500 each month needed there alone.
