

I find the opinion somewhat widely spread that the University of Chicago is deriving from this work a surplus income which it can devote to other purposes. The financial statement of our work for the year 1898-97 may serve to correct this impression. The University expended nearly \$40,000. for the various branches of the work which are carried on outside of the University, and which are known as University Extension. The total income from all departments of this work was \$31,000. showing that the University expended nearly \$9,000. a year more upon the work than it received in return.
