RULES.

1. The books are intended for the free use of students attending the lectures.

2. A record of the weekly circulation of each volume must be kept by a member of the local committee, or its representative, on this printed form. It is suggested that each volume should be issued for one week at the conclusion of each lecture, and that, at the expiration of the week, the borrower should be permitted to renew his loan, if no other application has been made for the volume.

This charging list is to be returned with the traveling library to the University of Chicago, at the end of the period for which the library is loaned.

3. If a volume be defaced or lost, the volume must be paid for. If a volume of a set be defaced or lost, the set must be paid for.

4. A slip, which will be found in each book, gives a provision for the purchase of a book in case a student may desire it. Any slips returned to the Local Secretary must be carefully preserved, and mailed to the University of Chicago, when a bill for the amount represented by them will be sent to the Local Secretary.
