These filthy dreamers defile the flesh, despise dominion and heare evil of dignitie. The heaven for height and the earth for depth and the heart of kings, is unsearchable. / 15<sup>th</sup> ver. Take away the wicked from before the king, and his throne shall be established in righteousness. / 16<sup>th</sup> ver. Behold this day, thine eyes have seen how that the Lord delivered thee to day into mine hand: and some bade me kill thee but mine eye spared thee, and I said, I will not pull forth mine hand against my Lord; for he is the Lords anointed. Moreover my father, see, yea see the skirt of thy robe in mine hand: For in that I cut off the skirt of thy robe, and killed thee not; knew thou, and see, that there is neither evil nor transgression in mine hand, and I have not sinned against thee; yet thou hast hunted my soul to take it. The Lord judge between me and thee and the Lord avenge me of thee: but mine hand shall not be upon thee. As with the proverbs of the wicked: but mine hand shall not be upon them.

So David and Abishai came to the people by night, beholding, but they sleeping within the trench, and his spear stuck in the ground at his bolster: but Abner and the people lay round about him. Then said Abishai to David, god hath delivered thine enemy into thine hand this day: now therefore let me smite him, I pray thee with the spear even to the earth, at once, and I will not smite him the second time.

And David said to Abishai, destroy him not: for who can stretch forth his hand against the Lord anointed and be guiltless? David said furthermore As the Lord liveth, the Lord shall smite him, or his day shall come to die, or he shall descend into the earth, and perish. The Lord against the Lord anointed stretch forth mine hand now the spear which is at his bolster, and take the curse of water, and let us go. So David took the spear and left us go. And when he awoke it, neither saw he David, and he knew it, neither was he awaked: for they were all asleep, because a deep sleep from the Lord was fallen upon them. And David went away.

And David commanded his young men and they slew them and cut off their hands and their feet and hanged them up over the pool in Hebron but they took the head of Ishbosheth and buried it in the sepulcher of Abner in Hebron.

The Rebellion and treason of Absalom against King David his father and most remarkable furnished by god almighty. And Absalom rose very early and stood beside the way of the gate; and it was so that when any man that had a controversy came to the king for judgment then Absalom called unto him and said of what city

the name of Elias. and in praise of him.

**Matthew** Chap: 6<sup>th</sup> ver: 19<sup>th</sup> Lay not up for your selves treasures upon earth where moth and rust doth corrupt, and where thieves break through, and steal.

We are not to set our hearts and affections on our  
uncertain riches as the foolish rich man in the  
parable of the rich man and Lazarus: Least  
the gospel did placing of his happiness therein: Least  
one so doing, (and so by robbing God of his glory, who  
only is it that giveth us power to get wealth) the  
same ill befall both unto us which then befell upon him.  
Take heed, and beware of covetousness: for a man's life  
consisteth not in the abundance of the things which  
he possesseth.

chap. 12<sup>th</sup> The ground of a certain rich man brought forth plenti-  
ver. 15<sup>th</sup>, 16<sup>th</sup> ful fruit: And he said This will I do, I will pull down my barns, and  
17<sup>th</sup>, 18<sup>th</sup> build greater, and there will I bestow all my fruits,  
19<sup>th</sup>, 20<sup>th</sup> and my goods.

And I will say to my soul Soul thou hast much good laid  
up, for many years, take thine ease, eat, drink, and

But God said unto him thou fool, this night thy soul shall

30<sup>th</sup> 31<sup>st</sup> voice from heaven saying O king Nebuchadnezzar,

32<sup>nd</sup> 33<sup>rd</sup> To thee it is spoken, The kingdom is departed from

thee. And they shall drive thee from men, and thy dwelling  
shall be with the beasts of the field; they shall make  
thee to eat grass as oxen and seven times shall

Therefor they said unto the king we basteth thee like this man saide unto the king we thus ha wakened the hands of the men of all tha reman in this city, and the hands of all tha people in speaking such wordz unto them: for this man saith not the wordz of this people, but tha huck.

Then Zedekiah the king said, Behold, he is in your hand.

Then took they Jeremiah and cast him into the dungeon, and they lay down Jeremiah with cords: and in the dungeon there was no water, but mire: so Jeremiah sunk in the mire.

Ebedmelech went forth out of the kings house, and spake to the king saying. My lord the king these men have done evil in all that they have done to Jeremiah the prophet, which they have cast into the dungeon and ha is like to die for hunger in the place where he is. Then the king commanded Ebedmelech saying, Take Jeremiah the prophet out of the dungeon before ha diere, and bring him up, out of the dungeon, and Jeremiah removed in the court of the prison.

Then Amariah the priest of Bethel, sent to Jeroboam king of Israel, saying, Amos hath conspired against them in the midst of the house of Israel: the land is not able to bear all his words.
