DID YOU SEE OUR PLAYGROUND THIS SUMMER?

T WAS used by over 1000 children. It was open all day until 8:30 p. m. under responsible supervision. These children were safe and happy and benefiting by the outdoor air and exercise all day long. In the adjoining lot organized teams under expert leaders played baseball and soccer ball, one team winning the Junior Intersettlement League baseball pennant.

The Center built this playground and maintained all supervision and expenses all season. It increased our expenses, but it was worth while. Mr. Stewart, aided by the older boys, constructed the entire equipment.

A great deal of work has been done this summer to promote the physical and moral welfare of the boys and girls of our neighborhood.

There were hikes and camping for the boys, under Mr. D. B. Stewart; camping for the Camp Fire Girls; outings for the Bluebird Girls' Club; and close touch kept with the neighborhood children through the playground.

The indoor schedule for work and recreation is as follows:

The Free Kindergarten,

from 9 to 12 every school day morning caring for tots of from 3 to 6 years.

The Employment Bureau

We can supply women to do day work, care for young children, do laundry work, cleaning and general house work. Also men and boys for almost any kind of work.

The Girls' Work,

under Miss Zelma Davidson, occupies the Center headquarters all afternoon, from 3 to 6, and Monday and Thursday evenings, while Friday evening is for both boys and girls. The Camp Fire work is prominent, embodying most of the things we have been striving for. We have two Camp Fire Camps of 18 girls in each group, and a third to start after Christmas. Cooking and sewing classes prosper, story hour is popular and gymnastic dancing classes for little and big girls, basket-ball, dramatics and clubs, occupying over 40 volunteer workers in the Girls' Department.

The Boys' Work,

under Mr. Sherman Conrad, late of Lincoln Center, runs every evening except Monday. On Thursday evening the boys swim in Bartlett Gymnasium tank; Friday is Club night for Dramatic, Boy Scouts, Round Table, and Civics Clubs; and the other nights basket ball and table games occupy the boys in harmless fun and keep them off the streets. Manual Training under direction of Mr. Stewart.

The Sunday Afternoons

at the Center are under the direction of the United Young People's Societies of the Hyde Park Churches. Children of all ages are admitted and cared for from 3 to 5.

The Library
