transfers of Real estate from Mordecai
Lincoln & Mary his wife to various
persons in 1806 & 7 nothing more,
also the Ministers return of marriage
of Tho Lincoln & Nancy Hanks the
Father & Mother of the Lamented
President who were married in 1806
There is no Settlement of estates or
Probating of Wills to show the

Maiden name of Abraham Lincoln
Mason who was killed in 1784

Dear Sir

I herewith send you the transcript of sale of land made by Mordica Lincoln as follows:

Mordica Lincoln & Mary his wife sold to Jos Kelly 103 acres 37 poles of land in Washington County Ky on the waters of Cartwrights Creek for the sum of Twenty pounds of date Dec 7th 1806

Dec 7th 1807 same numbe acres and same price

Mordica Lincoln & Mary Lincoln his wife sold Wilfred Hayden 300 acres of land in Washington County Ky on waters of Buck fork & Cartwrights creek for the sum of Two hundred pounds of date Feby 4th 1802=

28th June 1808 Mordica Lincoln legal heir of Abraham Lincoln conveyed to Mr. Womard 500 acres in Pendleton County Ky patented in the name of Abraham Lincoln for 5 Shillings

In regard to Mordica Lincoln representing this county I have no date to go by. But I remember of hearing my uncle Hon Judge Paul C. Brooker remark to some hot heads when

Abraham Lincoln was first elected President
That he did not know Abraham Lincoln but
if he was as good a man as his Uncle Mordcai
Lincoln who I served with in the Legislature of
Ky you need have no fears I do not know what
year ^{he} ~~the~~ served if I did I might find it in
some of the old acts of the Legislature

Abraham Lincoln the father of Mordcai & Grand
father of President Lincoln was the last white
man killed by the Indians in this county and
his ponder horn & bullet pouch ~~are~~ now in the
Museum in ^{Louisville} ~~Lynch~~. Hoping my remarks
may serve you in your undertaking
