Under the recent arrangement for providing our men (prisoners) with clothing &c. proposed by you and approved by General Grant - it seems that Genl Wm R.R. Beall has been selected by the U.S. Govt to perform the duty -

If you nominated two officers (myself & Genl B) without any conditions as to choice the selection of Genl Beall is regular & proper. But on the contrary if I was nominated or appointed by you, and Genl Beall to take my place, in case of disability or other cause preventing me from doing the duty, then his selection is contrary to the spirit of your proposal, inasmuch as in health & activity I am fully able to perform the duty promptly -

If there be the latter sense as above, be the true intention on your part, I hope it may yet be carried out - as relief from a long confinement and change of diet are very desirable and

much indebted by me -

In answer to an application from me to General Grant, he assents to "the Detachment of Six of our officers to assist in carrying out the arrangement, provided the Comd'g authority, allow the same to the U.S. Army."

As the purchase or transportation of anything cannot be made, with the desirable promptness in the north, without the aid of assistants - I beg you will at once effect this arrangement with General Grant in which General Beall accords with me -
