

A student who has received an admission condition may obtain its removal, within the year after his entrance, by excellence of College work in the special subject in which he was conditioned. Conditions not so removed can be made up only at the beginning of some subsequent academic year, at the regular examination for admission, or at such special examinations as may be authorized by the Faculty.



## Regulations printed for the Information of Parents or Guardians.

### ADMISSION.

1. If it should appear, on examination, that a candidate, though capable of pursuing the studies of the class for which he is offered, is yet deficient in certain branches, he may be admitted on condition of making up the deficiency.
2. Every person admitted to the University must give a bond to the President and Fellows of Harvard College, executed to the satisfaction of the Bursar, by two bondsmen, of whom one at least is a resident citizen of Massachusetts, in the sum of four hundred dollars, for the payment of all College dues according to the laws and customs of the University; or, if he prefer, he may make, in place of the bond, a deposit of money or of a United States registered bond of sufficient amount with the Bursar for the same purpose.

On the first day of the academic year, or as soon after as may be, he must exhibit to the Dean a certificate from the Bursar that a bond has been given as required, and must enter his name in the Admission Book.

No officer or student of the University will be accepted as bondsman.

### TERM BILLS.

The bills containing college charges will be made out three times a year by the Bursar, and each bill will contain one-third of the annual charges. The first bill will be ready for delivery December 22, and is to be paid on or before January 12. The second bill will be ready for delivery March 15, and is to be paid on or before April 5. The third bill will be ready for delivery one week before Commencement, and is to be paid on or before October 10; but the third bill of the *Senior Year* must be paid at least one day before Commencement.

If any student shall have failed to pay the Bursar, on or before the appointed day for the settlement of bills, every bill due by him, except the last, he will not be permitted to continue at the University. If any student shall be absent for non-payment of a bill for more than one month after the date at which payment ought to have been made by this law, his connection with the University will cease; nor will he be readmitted, except on the usual conditions of readmission after a separation.

Whereas, a portion of the assets of said Company are of uncertain value and cannot be made available as a part of the reserve of said Company under the rules of the insurance departments of the different states, and it has become necessary to reduce the liabilities of said Company.

Now, therefore, in consideration of the premises, and of the mutual agreements hereinafter made by each of said parties, it is agreed as follows, to wit:

The said parties of the first part hereby agree to and with said Company, that the amount originally payable by the terms of policy No. 78465, insuring the life of

And the said CHARTER OAK LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY hereby agrees with said party of the first part, that the amount of the annual premium required to be paid by the terms of said policy be and is hereby reduced as to all future annual premiums two-fifths, to wit: from the sum of

dollars per annum to the sum of dollars per annum, to be paid at the same times and under the same conditions as heretofore.

If a Receiver shall be appointed for said Company, this agreement shall, in that event, become null and void.




