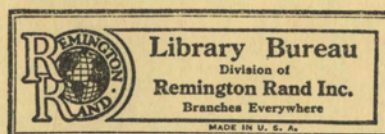

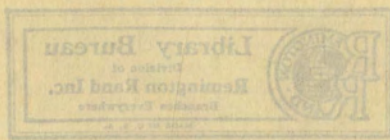

Memorandum of Agreement between

Carl D. Buck

&

Wm. R. Harper, Chairman of Committee on Faculty of Univ. of Chicago.

Mr. Buck consents to accept the position of Assistant Professor of Indo-European Comparative Philology in the University of Chicago, with the understanding

1) that his salary shall be two thousand dollars (\$2000.00) a year, beginning Oct. 1, 1892;

2) that within three years he shall be promoted to an associate professorship at a salary of twenty-five hundred dollars;

3) that, so far as possible, opportunity will be afforded for extra work, if he desires to do it, in accordance with the regulations of the University;

4) that for at least two years he will consent to do the work in Sanskrit, provided such work shall not constitute more than one-half of his entire work in the University.
