As perhaps you know, Earl Grey, Lord Shaw and other distinguished Englishmen, together with a Canadian delegation including Sir Edmund Walker and Sir Alexander Lacoste, will visit the United States about May first, to confer with our American committee concerning the coming Hundred Years of Peace Celebration in 1914-1915. Invitations also have been sent to Sir Edward Morris, Premier of Newfoundland, and Sir George Reid, Lord High Commissioner of Australia, and it is hoped that these gentlemen may be present.

Chicago probably will be honored with the presence of these distinguished visitors during their brief tour of a few of the more important cities.

As the Honorary Secretary of the National Committee, you are hereby most cordially invited to be present at a luncheon to be held in the Tower Room of the Union League Club, on Thursday noon, March 13, at 12.30 o'clock. May we hope for the honor of your acceptance? The luncheon will be on our usual Chicago plan - each paying for his own. The price will be one dollar per plate.

The function of calling this committee together, for organization and the formulation of local plans, would seem properly to belong to the Mayor, but His Honor has suggested that President Goddard of the Peace Society take the initiative, and under instructions from the latter the call hereby is issued.
