Upon further study of the situation President Judson is satisfied that in the agreement with the Chicago Theological Seminary as to supplying recitation rooms and library space, the agreement provides that those items shall be supplied "temporarily." In view of the fact that it seems desirable that all of the theological instruction should be given in the theological recitation rooms and further that the libraries might well be housed with the library of the University and made a working part of it, his recommendation is that the word "temporary" be omitted as to furnishing both of these items, viz. recitation rooms for the Seminary and library space. Your approval will bring the matter before the Board for action at its next meeting.

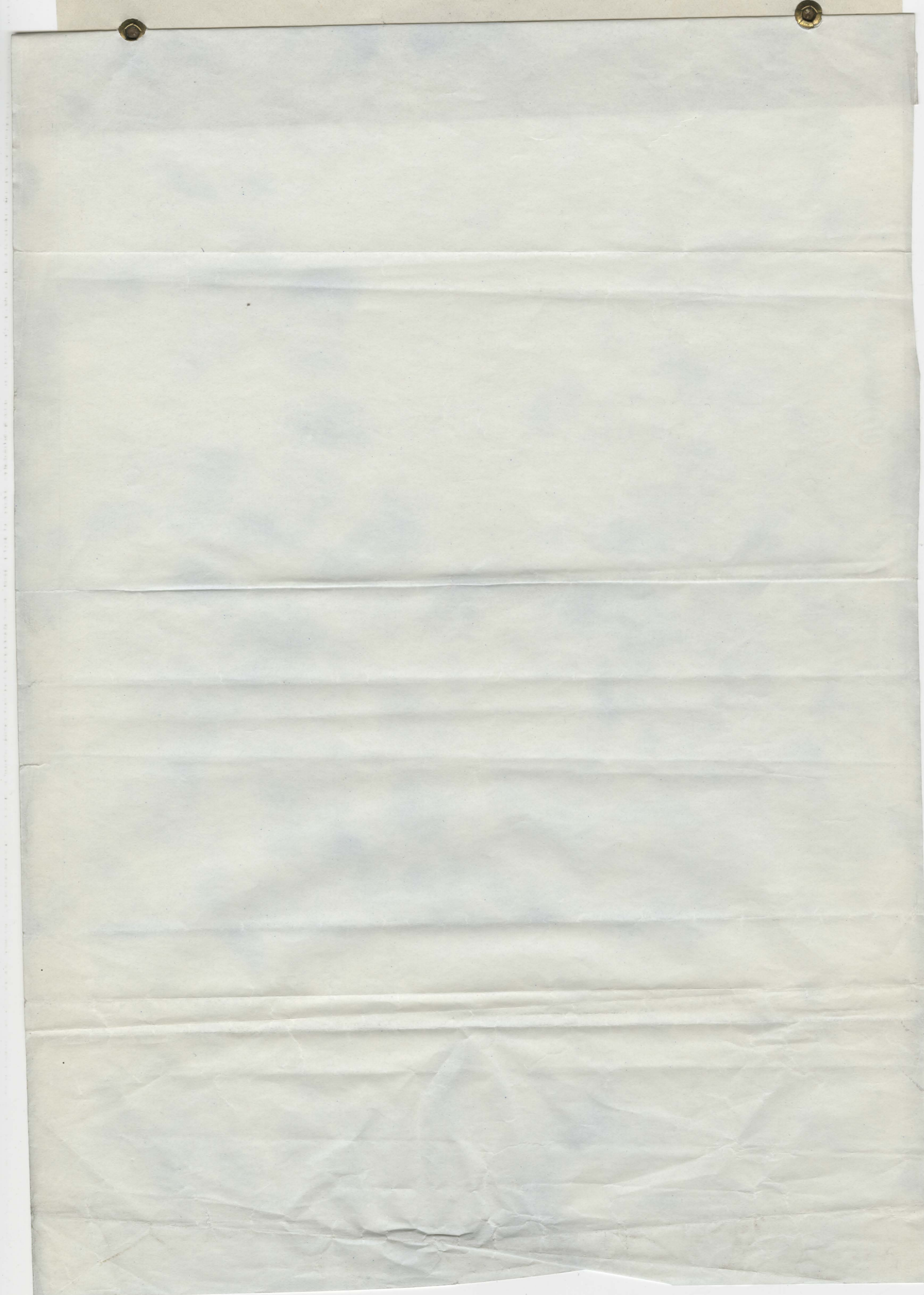

Memorandum of agreement between the University of Chicago and the Chicago Theological Seminary in reference to the receipt by the University of Chicago of books from the library of the Chicago Theological Seminary and the purchase of books on account of the Chicago Theological Seminary.

1. Subject to such limitations as the available space may impose, the University will give shelf room to any books offered by the Chicago Theological Seminary, preference being given, in case of limitation of space, to books of value to the University and not duplicated in the University Libraries. The Chicago Theological Seminary will reserve from its collections such books as it may desire for use in a house library in its own building.

2. For such books as are already owned by the Chicago Theological Seminary and are delivered to the University under this arrangement, the Chicago Theological Seminary will furnish catalogue cards and the University will file these cards alongside of or in the catalogue of the Divinity School Library.

3. For books which are to be shelved in the Libraries of the University, the University will receive recommendations from professors of the Chicago Theological Seminary and on the account of that school, and make purchases under the same conditions as for the various departments of the University. For the purchase of books which the Chicago Theological Seminary wishes to add to its house library in its own building, the University Libraries will, if desired, act as purchasing agent without expense to the Chicago Theological Seminary.

4. The Library of the Divinity School being only temporarily catalogued, the University Libraries will catalogue new books as received

on the same conditions and in the same way as books for the Divinity
Library, and if this agreement remains in force till such time as the
Divinity Library may be recatalogued, will recatalogue these books as

on the same conditions and in the same way as books for the Divinity Library, and if this agreement remains in force till such time as the Divinity Library may be recatalogued, will recatalogue these books as if belonging to the Divinity Library. The University will not, however, obligate itself to place cards for books of the Chicago Theological Seminary in its general University catalogue in the Harper Library, but will reserve the right to do so or not, as may seem expedient.

5. The title of the Chicago Theological Seminary to these books will be indicated by a suitable label or bookplate, inserted in all old books by the Chicago Theological Seminary and in new books by the University in connection with the ordinary processes of cataloguing.

6. Should the relationship between the University of Chicago and the Chicago Theological Seminary at any time be dissolved, the University will at the request and at the expense of the Chicago Theological Seminary withdraw from the Libraries of the University all books belonging to the Chicago Theological Seminary and bearing marks of its ownership, and the cards for the same from the catalogues and deliver them to the Chicago Theological Seminary.

7. The expense of placing books belonging to the Chicago Theological Seminary, or purchased by it, on the shelves of the University Libraries under this agreement having been divided between the Chicago Theological Seminary and the University of Chicago, the former furnishing the books and the latter cataloguing and storing them, all such books shall be open to use by members of the University at large under the general rules of the University Libraries or the specific rules of the departmental library. 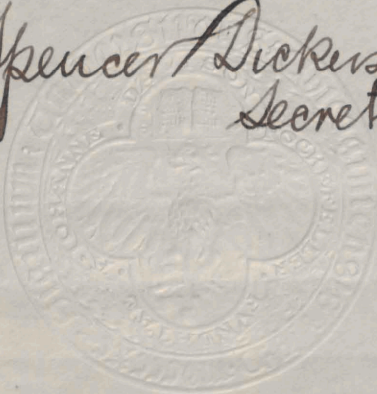
the Chicago Theological Seminary shall have the same privileges respect-

the Chicago Theological Seminary shall have the same privileges respecting the various Libraries of the University as members of the Faculty of the University, and students of the Chicago Theological Seminary the same privileges as students of the Divinity School of the University.

8. In order to create a credit against which purchases of books on account of the Chicago Theological Seminary, as specified in (3) above, may be charged, the Chicago Theological Seminary will at the beginning of each quarter of the school year pay to the University of Chicago such a sum as it contemplates using for the purchase of books within the succeeding quarter. If this sum is at any time exhausted by orders placed against it, the Chicago Theological Seminary will be notified and the purchase of books suspended ~~until further notice~~ pending the receipt of further funds.

In administering this article of agreement, each institution may indicate the list of courses given by the faculty of the other for which it will give credit toward its degree without further examination.

4. Students of affiliated seminaries who desire the D.B. degree from the Graduate Divinity School of the University of Chicago may receive such degree after matriculation and registration, in accordance with the general regulations governing the granting of degrees in the Divinity School; it being understood that at least one year (i.e., nine majors) of actual residence in the Graduate Divinity School shall be a prerequisite for such a degree.

IV. COURSES GIVEN BY THE FACULTIES OF ARTS, LITERATURE, AND SCIENCE.

1. Students of affiliated seminaries may be admitted to courses given by members of the Faculties of Arts, Literature and

school under the same conditions as students of that school.

2. Students of the Graduate Divinity School of the

(b) Students who are not matriculated and registered in the Graduate Divinity School of the University of Chicago shall pay tuition to the University of Chicago for courses given by the Faculties of Arts, Literature and Science. *as other students of the U. of C. in the college under the same conditions*

2. Students of affiliated seminaries who wish to acquire the A.B., Ph.D., or the S.B. degree from the University of Chicago shall conform to the regulations governing the conferring of such degrees.

3. Students of affiliated seminaries who desire the A.M. and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Chicago may be matriculated and registered in the Graduate Divinity School of the University of Chicago and receive the degree in accordance with the regulations of the Graduate Divinity School and the Graduate School of Arts, Literature and Science.

V. MISCELLANEOUS.

1. Students of affiliated theological seminaries may occupy rooms in the dormitories or enjoy other privileges of the Graduate Divinity School of the University of Chicago, provided they are matriculated and registered in the Graduate Divinity School.

2. The University of Chicago will provide, without cost,

Memorandum of Agreement Between Affiliated Theological

A theological seminary may become affiliated with the University of Chicago under the following conditions:
