Dear Sir:

The "University of Chicago Dames' Club" is an organization of the wives of married students in attendance at the University. It is of some years' standing, and its object is mainly social. For obvious reasons it serves a purpose not covered by the Woman's Union or any similar organization.

The Club has labored under two difficulties. First the homes of its members are not large enough to accomodate the meetings, and second no complete list of married students is at hand and in consequence many wives of students spend a considerable time here without becoming known to the Club or its members. A regrettable illustration of this second point is the fact that during the current year there have been at least two deaths of students' wives in cases where the Club did not even know of the presence or existence of the wife in question until after the funeral.

To remedy the first difficulty we respectfully ask that if it be possible, a suitable room be granted the Club in which to hold its meetings. These are held on the first and third Saturdays of each month at three P.M. Any room with seating facilities and free from interruption during the meetings would be satisfactory. The room would not be wanted at any other time than that specified, and the Club would not begin its use until the coming autumn. The right to hold its meetings in a fixed place centrally located would do much to further the progress of the Club.

Under the second point, we suggest that some means be taken by the University to ascertain what students are married. Perhaps a question on the registration blank would answer the purpose, and a student if married
