



#### RULES OF ELIGIBILITY FOR INTER-FRATERNITY MEET.

- Competitors in annual inter-fraternity meet shall be regularly registered students in the University, who are members of national, literary, Greek-letter societies having active chapters in the University of Chicago, and shall conform to the following regulations:
  - 2. Men who have never won a point for a University may compete,
- 3. Men who, while representing the University in scratch events, have won points, may compete under the following conditions:
- (a) Track men who have never won a point in field events may compete in field events.
- (b) Field men who have never won a point in track events may compete in track events.
- (c) It shall be understood that men who have competed on relay teams do not forfeit their right to compete in track events unless they have been members of the University relay team, and won a C in that vent.
- (d) Men who have won points in collegiate contests for other universities are subject to the same rules as if they had been members of the Chicago team.
- 4. The events and order of events shall be the same as those run off by the College Conference Athletic Association for the current year, with the exception of the relay race, which shall be a half mile race, each fraternity entering six men and starting four; each man to run 220 yards.
- All entries must be made at least ten days before the annual inter-fraternity meet, and only three entires may be made by each fraternity for any one event.
- These rules as agreed upon may be changed only by a threefourths vote of the fraternities in the University of Chicago.





Tufts Harper Library Dear Dr. Tufts: I beg to protest against the withdrawal from Mr. O'Hara and the dramatic interests of the University, of the stage dressing room of the Reynolds Club Theater. The appointment of Mr. O'Hara as Director of Dramatics implied the provision of facilities making it possible for him to carry on his work effectively. As a result of correspondence early this Ouarter with Mr. Gale, as Chairman of the Committee on Assignment of Space, and Mr. Nelson, as Head of the Reynolds Club, the use of that dressing room was definitely given to Mr. O'Hara. It now appears that without previous consultation with Mr. O'Hara, that room has been taken over, or is to be taken over, as a broadcasting room. This not only greatly limits the usefulness of the whole theater plant, but will make it impossible to hold any rehearsals whatsoever in the Reynolds Club Theater while broadcasting is going on. Will you not endeavor to make for the broadcasting other arrangements which shall not so seriously cripple the work of Mr. O'Hara? Very truly yours, Dean of the Colleges EHW/ES

Dear Miss Talbot:

Mr. Frank O'Hara, as you know, has been appointed Director of Student Dramatic Activities for the current year, and is entering upon his work in excellent spirit.

In connection with the dramatic work, he feels the need of a room suitable for meetings of the Dramatic Association and for reading rehearsals and voice training, and of an adecuately equipped theater for regular rehearsals and dramatic training of various sorts. He has therefore asked for the use of the room in Mitchell Tower formerly used as the band room, and for the use for two hours a day, four afternoons a week, of the Reynolds Club Theater.

So far as the assignment of space is concerned, no difficulty is involved, for Dean Gale, as Chairman of the Committee on Space, has agreed to his use of the band room, and Mr. Nelson, as head of Reynolds Club, has agreed to his use of the Reynolds Theater.


Inasmuch as the plan involves access by women as well as men, however, I have desired to submit the matter to your approval before authorizing him to proceed.

In each case Mr. O'Hara understands and agrees that the room or theater would be open to students only at times when he was himself present or had definitely authorized the presence of students; and it is further agreed that the Dramatic Association would not use the theater during the time while Blackfriars are using it.

As far as the passage of women through the Reynolds Club is concerned, Mr. Nelson writes that he has no objection, and sees none from the point of view of the Club. X Mr. O'Hara's reasons for needing the Reynolds Club Theater rather than Ida Noyes Theater are set forth in a letter which I inclose.

I am hoping that under these conditions you will approve such use of the tower room and the Reynolds Theater.
