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

My dear Dr. Ormsby:

Thanks to Mr. Harper's telephone message this morning. I have been able to look up the matter of Dr. Hamilton Montgomery's appointment. Upon examination I find that the Hyde Memorial Fund is a fund of the University of Chicago and not of Rush Medical College. Therefore, recommendations should go to President Burton as President of the University and not to the Rush Medical Board.

The Montgomery recommendation and that of Dr. Peterson and Dr. Ebert all came to me after the meeting of the Board of Trustees of Rush Medical College in December and have been held in my hands awaiting the next meeting of the Rush Medical College Board, as I supposed this was a Rush Board matter. The Ebert and Peterson recommendations will be made to the Rush Board at its next meeting.

I have asked the University Auditor to send Dr. Montgomery a check. It will be mailed in a day or so. As I understand it he is appointed as Hyde Fellow for twelve months from January 1, 1924, at salary of \$1,200. Will you please conform these two points - duration of appointment and amount of salary - and the matter will hereafter automatically take care of itself.

Hereafter will you please nominate to President Burton asking him to appoint the Fellow and then to report to the University Board.

I hope I have not been guilty in suggesting an incorrect method of precedure on the assumption that this was a Rush Fellowship.
