I am to sail for Yokohama on November 9th, from San Francisco on the "Korea Maru". I shall spend perhaps two or three months in Yokohama and Tokio and then go to Hong Kong. I shall be about Hong Kong for some months and in the spring or summer go to Northern China.

I am to be an observer and propagandist for the International Banking Corporation (National City Bank of New York) and will be investigating social, economic and political conditions and looking for business openings. I hope to be able to promote in some degree friendly business relations between our country and Japan and China. It is the most interesting and far reaching piece of work I have ever attempted.

In order to succeed in this attempt I am anxious to meet in a friendly way some influential people in Japan and China and again I am turning to you who have been so kind to me in times past.
