

Dear Mr. Sparks:-

My time is so taken up from now until after the opening of the Summer Quarter that I cannot be present at the meeting June 8th.

May I call attention to one point? The vaudeville has sometimes been in need of supervision by someone with taste. Two years ago especially certain offensive speeches were made from the stage. I am sure that you will sympathise with me in my feeling that we ought to set a standard of gentlemanliness in our entertainment as well as spectsmanship in our athletics.
