


Dear Dr. Judson:

I have yours May 16th with Mr. Heckman's letter attached.

Mr. Frank L. Shepard and I appeared before the joint committee of the City Council, Illinois Central and South Park Board today and explained the situation along the lines of our talk a few weeks ago. We urged that no small matters be allowed to delay or block the negotiations and tried to impress the members of the Committee that there was a tremendous public sentiment on the South Side back of all that could possibly be accomplished in getting the construction of the outer drive under way.

Mr. Markham told me as I was leaving the meeting that later on they would probably reach a point where it would be necessary to have plenty of help, in which case he would let me know. I told him that we are ready to do anything that is necessary to help the ratification of a fair contract.
