A few days agh I received from you a marked announcement of the so-called "Lincoln-Jefferson College of Law" at Hammond, Ind. Until recently, I believe, this was a correspondence school. The ceremony of admission to the various courts upon oath, which is published as a feature of their Commencement, is peculiar to Indiana, where the state constitution provides that any person of good moral character must be admitted to the bar by the courts, without examination. Those who avail themselves of this permission are locally known as "constitutional" lawyers. This happy provision of Indiana law, as well as the "educating and refining influences" of proximity to Chicago, and the "active marts of trade and commerce" in Hammond, doubtless influenced the authorities in establishing their institution just across the Indiana line. One of our recent graduates, Mr. Van Schaick, has been doing a little "pot Boiling" by giving instruction in one course there.

To ALL Whom These Presents Shall Come. Greeting: I, Lewis G. Stevenson, Secretary of the State of Illinois, by virtue of the powers and duties vested in me by law, do hereby certify that the said Lincoln-Jefferson University is a legally organised Corporation under the laws of this State. In Testimony whereof I have hereto set my hand and caused to be affixed the Great Seal of the State of Illinois. Done at the City of Springfield this 7th day of July, A.D. 1915, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and fortieth.

## AMERICAN DEGREES



My dear President Judson: -

I return the circular regarding the Lincoln-Jefferson University with the following facts:

- 1. The Institution was incorporated July 7, 1915.
- 2. The charter defines the purposes of the Institution as follows:

"The object for which it is formed is to maintain and operate a school or schools, not for profit, in which students may obtain a classical, mathematical, scientific, technical, legal, medical or general education, either by providing for the delivery of lectures and holding of exhibitions, classes and conferences, or by correspondence through the mails or otherwise; to establish and maintain libraries, reading and writing rooms, and school or lecture rooms, and furnishing the same with books and publications; to employ professors, lecturers and instructors."

3. It appears also that the institution was incorporated under the laws of the State of Indiana and the right of the Indiana corporation to do business in this State was revoked July 1, 1920 for failure to file the annual report due in February, 1920.

length the activities of the so-called LincolnJefferson University in England. This institution
purports to have articles of incorporation under the
laws of Illinois. I regret that our laws are so
loose. As a matter of fact any three persons may
file articles of incorporation under the statutes
for any lawful purpose not for pecuniary profit.
The institution in question we cannot find in Chicago.
It seems to have no address here, and the various
addresses suggested are not in evidence. Doubtless
Dr. Machean has told you of their activities in
England. I am surprised to hear that they are
recognized by the Regents of the State of New York.
I wonder if that body is informed as too the character
