Boston, where I shall be until Sept 1.

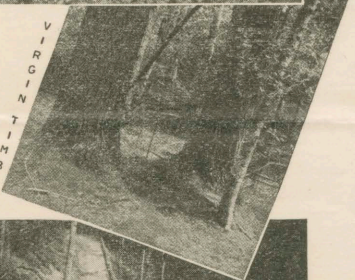

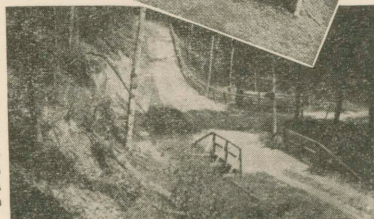

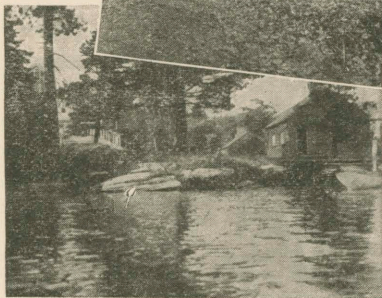
