





MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT made this nineteenth day of December, A.D. 1921, between RUSH MEDICAL COLLEGE, a corporation of the state of Illinois, hereinafter referred to as the "College", party of the first part, and the ILLINOIS DEMONSTRATORS' ASSOCIATION, a voluntary association of Chicago, Illinois, hereinafter referred to as the "Association", party of the second part, WITNESSETH:

That the said College, being the owner of the premises known as no. 1743 W. Harrison Street, including a certain one-story brick structure approximately 32' x 19', located in the rear of the laboratory building upon said premises, does hereby lease the said one-story brick structure to the said Association for a term of five (5) years beginning on the first day of December, A.D. 1921, and ending on the first day of December, A.D. 1926, unless the term hereby demise shall be sooner terminated as hereinafter provided.

In consideration of said demise the Lessee covenants and agrees as follows:

1. To pay to the College, as rent for the said premises, the sum of Five (5) Dollars in five (5) equal annual installments of One (1) Dollar each, beginning on the first day of the term of this lease.
2. That the Association will use and occupy the said premises for a storage building for receiving, keeping, and distributing cadavers, and also to house the truck or wagon of the said Association used in connection therewith, such housing to be built as hereinafter provided.
3. That the Association takes possession of the said premises in their present condition and agrees to make all repairs and alterations as may be necessary from time to time or as may be required by public authority, and agrees at the termination of this lease by lapse of time or otherwise to return the said premises to the College in good condition, loss by fire and ordinary wear excepted.

IT IS FURTHER UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED that the said premises are to be altered and repaired in order to meet the necessary requirements of the said Association, under plans, specifications, and contracts which shall be first approved by the President of the Board of Trustees of the said College and by the President of The University of Chicago, and the said College agrees to advance to the said Association the cost of making such alterations and repairs, but not to exceed the sum of Three Thousand Three Hundred (3,300) Dollars, and the said Association agrees to repay said advances in five (5) equal annual installments on the thirtieth day of December in each year of the term of this lease, together with interest at six (6) per cent per annum, payable annually on the amount of such advance from the date when such advance is made, up to the several dates of partial repayment thereof.

IT IS FURTHER UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED that the College reserves the right to cancel this lease at any time, upon giving six (6) months prior notice to the president or secretary of the said Association, and in the event of the exercise by the College of the said right of cancellation the said Association shall be relieved of all further repayments of the amount advanced for repairs and alterations above referred to, including interest, falling due after the date of such ter-
