

Dear Mr. Burton:

I can find nothing in Mr. Wilson's gift to the Institute more than \$5,000.00 a year for three years as running expenses of a laboratory. If there is more than this, my informant, - a member of the Educational Committee of the Institute of American Meat Packers, has not been advised of it. My informant thinks that it is hooked up with the University in some way and supposes that we are furnishing a room for the purpose, but doesn't know.

I understand that Mr. Spencer has succeeded Mr. Filbey in charge of the educational activities so that it seems to me a perfectly proper thing for him to make detailed inquiries in the matter.
