He was educated for the ministry at Leydon where he took the degree of Doctor of Philosophy in 1689. At the age of twenty-two he began the study of medicine. He read Hippocrates diligently, and took his degree at Herdensick in 1693, after which he practiced in Leyden. He succeeded Drelincourt as lecturer at the university of that city. His precise definitions, brilliant eloquence and immense erudition rendered him a very popular lecturer. He obtained in 1709 the chair vacated by Hatton at Laydea on which occasion he pronounced a discourse in favor of simplicity in the practice of medicine. His reputation was widely extended by an excellent systematic work entitled Medical Institutes. He gave a classification of diseases and explained their causes, nature and treatment, in his aphorisms on the Disgnosis and Cure of Diseases. The reputation of Boorhaave, as a physician and a man, is, perhaps, without parallel in history. Died 23rd of September, 1788.

George Chretien Leopold Frederic Cuvier. An illustrous philosopher, statesman, and suthor, and one of the greatest naturalists of modern times; Was born on the 25rd of August, 1769, at Montbeliard, then a part of the German expire, now in Doubs, a department in Prance. His parents zere Protestants of French wrigin. The favorite smusement of his childhood was to copy and color the figures in Buffon's works. His early essays on natural history attracted the notice of Jussieu and Geoffery, and when he arrived in Paris in March, 1795, he was looked upon as one to give a new impulse to science. In 1795 he became assistant professor of comparative anatomy in the Sussum of Natural History. He immediately began to form his great cabinet of comparative anatomy. In 1802 he was chosen perpetual secretary of the Academy of Sciences. He produced in 1817 his delebrated Animal Kingdom. This work immediately took the highest rank among books of the kind, and became generally the basis or guide of soological studies throughout Europe.
