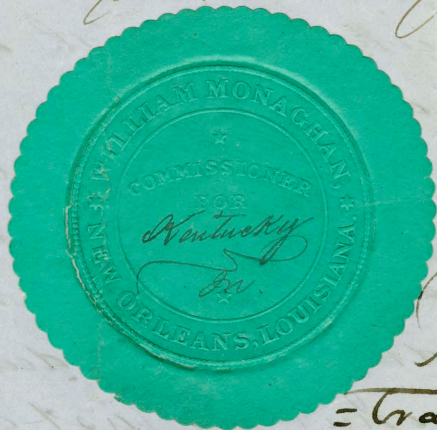

Magdalen County State of Kentucky

John Love made oath before me a Justice of the Peace for said County that the note hereto annexed for Eight hundred and sixty four dollars dated November ~~15~~. 1848 on R S Todd and due twelve months after date is unpaid, and is just and due, and that there is no offset legal or equitable to any part of it known to him, except the sum of thirty two dollars 96 cents usury included in said note, which is all the usury in it, leaving due of the principal of said note Eight hundred and thirty one dollar and 4 cents with legal interest from 15 November 1849 - The consideration of said note being Eight hundred dollars loaned to R S Todd on the 15th November 1847. at eight per cent interest, which was renewed on the maturity of that note, said Todd paying the interest. Given under my hand this 1 January 1851.
