Case No Report of Case, in 149th Ill Cal.

Pirate Daniel Waters Co "1" 149th Ill Cal. was
taken sick on the 11th day of March/65 and on
the same day, was sent to Post Hospital
Cleveland Tenn. The disease was pronounced to be
Mumps. On the 17th of the same month, ~~he~~
~~he was~~ discharged from the hospital and
joined his Company, which was guarding a
block house ^{at} Ooltowah Tenn. He felt
quite well, until the next morning the 18th
when an eruption of Measles made its
appearance. The latter disease caused him
but little trouble, and was doing well.
The Measles eruption having disappeared,
On the following Sunday the 26th he complains
of feeling unwell and had a chill.
On Monday 27th had chill and the appearance
of an eruption caused his Captain and himself
to fear that he had Small Pox. The next day
he was visited by Post Surgeon Mercer and
the case pronounced Small Pox March 28th
At this time April 4th 1865 he is with his Co, well.

Can No 2, About 9 O, Clock, on the 1st day of April 1865.
Two men hurriedly rushed into my barrack
at Cleveland Tenn. and one of them approaching
me, threw both hands on my shoulder,
cried out, "O. Doctor I am shot through
the heart." He had hardly finished the
sentence, when I noticed that he was about
to fall. I held him up until assistance
came, and placed him on the floor of
the tent. In two or three minutes he
was dead. Thus died Sergeant M^c Bride
of Co C, 14th Ill. A Comrade, Saml
E P Clark of the same Co. had shot him
with the Smallest Size Smith & Weston Pistol
Parr Morton. The ball entered the side 3
inches to the left of the left nipple, and a
half inch above a direct line, penetrating
the left Lung, and left Pulmonary Artery.
The left side of the chest was full of blood,
Death caused by hemorrhage. After being
shot he ran about sixty paces.

Case No 3, Private Benj. Bowler Co "G," 149th Ill. Inf.
21 yrs. age, is very deaf. Is totally unfit
for the duties of a Soldier, on account of this
disability, was discharged from the 62^d Ill.
I Company, on account of disability. He
appears to be nearly idiotic. Can not tell
me the year, that he was discharged from
the Service, Has never been on Picket
while in Camp, Can not tell where he
was mustered in, to the Service, Says
that two men told him, he would be drafted
if he did not enlist. They took him to
one examining Surgeon, who rejected him.

I am informed, that he was mustered in
at Jacksonville Ill., He states that
he only received two hundred dollars as a
local bounty.

Case No 4. Private George Elliott Co. G. 149th Ill. Inf.
States that he was enlisted and mustered
- in to the U S Service at Jacksonville
Ill. on the Seventh of Feb 1865.

He states that in the Spring of 1863, he was
attacked with a disease of the hip joint,
from which he ^{was} confined to his bed three months,
and from the beginning of the disease to this
time he has never been free from pain.
Present Condition of Hip & Leg. The left thigh
at its middle is an inch and a half less
in diameter than the right, is much less
developed. He can not place both heels
together with the feet turned out, without
pain, bearing weight on the left leg
causes pain. Hip joint very stiff.

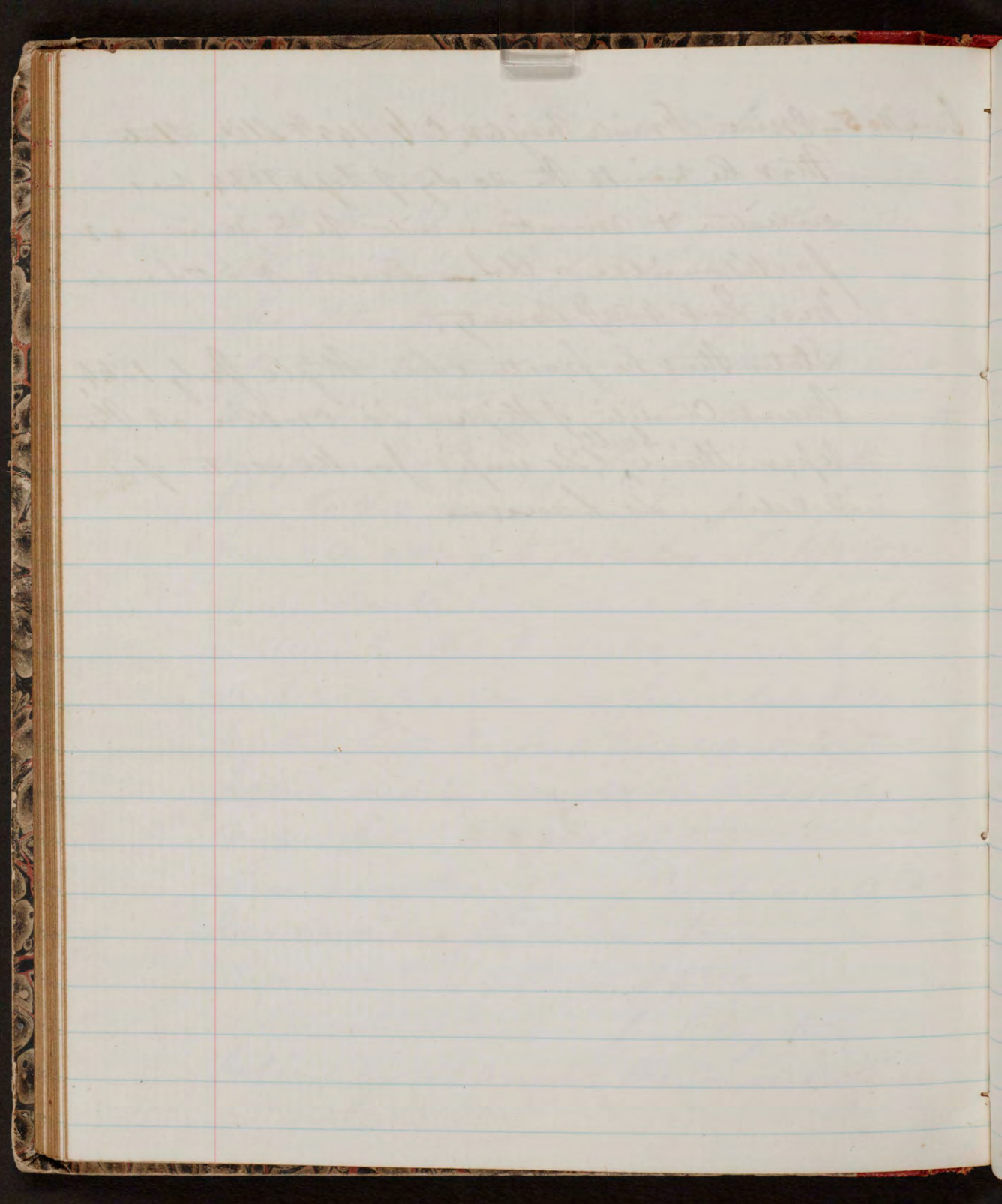

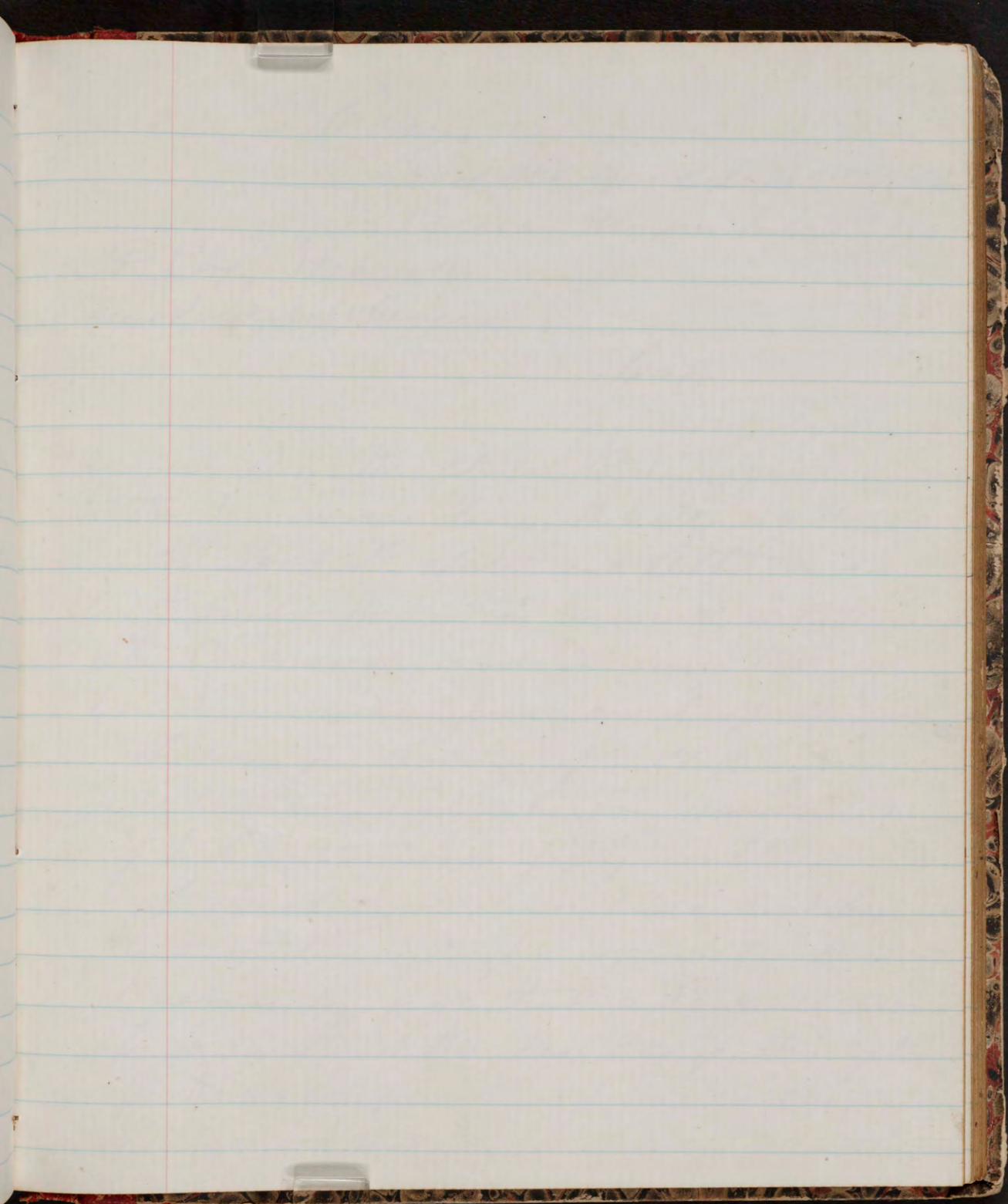

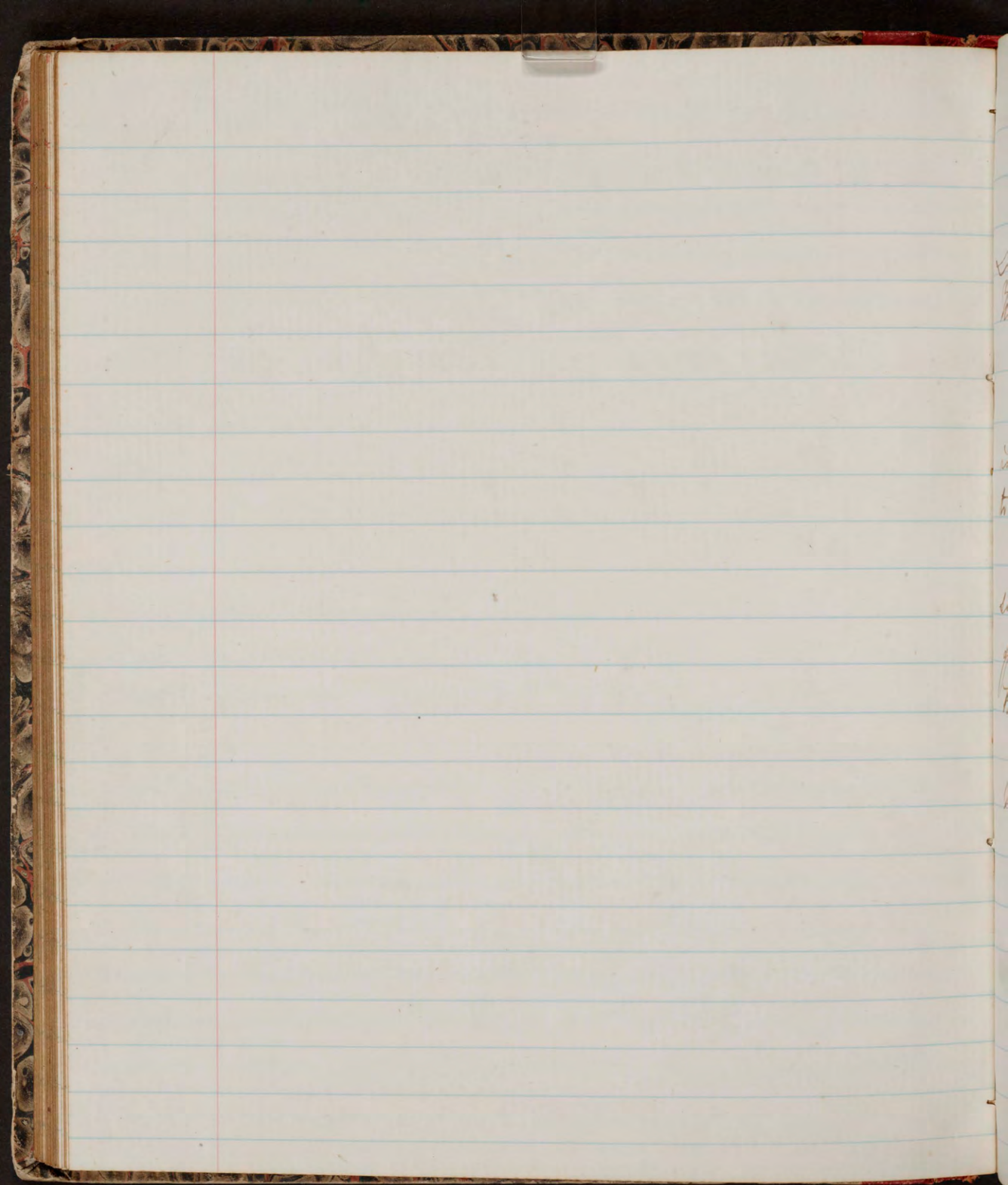

marked & unmistakable. Either disability,
in the absence of the other, would disqualify
the said Bales from doing the duties of a Soldier.

This Soldier enlisted Feb 3rd /865 at Jacksonville
Ill. I first saw him on the 27th day of the same
month. His face then as now bore all indi-
cations of an unsound mind. Bales states
that at one time he was a member of the

61st Regt Ill Volt. Why he was discharged,
when, or to what Company he belonged. I can
not learn. Whether the deafness^d & Advice were
acquired or congenital, I do not know.

According to the description book of Co "G." 149th

I hereby certify that on or about the
twenty ninth day of January 1865. I became acquaint-
-ed with Benjamin Bales now a private of co
"G" 149th Ill Valt. at Tolono Illinois. He was then
as he is now, very deaf, ^{and} of an unimpaired mind.
He was in company with two men, one of whom
was called Captain Crow. The other Lieutenant
Williams. These men were Substitute Brothers.
Crow ^{and} Williams took Bales ^{and} six others to
Danville Ills. All were examined by the
Surgeon except myself. Bales with two
others was rejected on account of physical
disability. Crow ^{and} Williams then removed
Bales with the other two before mentioned,
to Jacksonville Ills. where they were examined
by the Surgeon at the recruiting office of the
district. ^{and} passed, ^{and} were mustered into the
Service. I was present when Bales was ex-
-amined by the Surgeon. Bales was striped.
The Surgeon asked him a question. Bales did
not answer, but placed himself in the position

for turning a hand spring or summer set,
Williams I think made a sign that caused
Bales to omit this part of the performance,
and at the same time told the Surgeon that
Bales was a German and could not speak
English. A German, who was present, offered
his assistance as interpreter, but Williams
informed him that his services were not
required, or words to that effect. Questions
and answers passed between the Surgeon and,
Williams after this, Bales did not speak during
the examination. Williams stated to me
that he was to give Bales two hundred dollars,
and Bales states that he received that amount
for enlisting to the credit of some Town in
the state of Illinois, — I received at the
same time four hundred dollars, for
enlisting, in local bounty.

it can be avoided. My Regiment came into the field during the last winter. The men have seen no severe service since they were shipped from their homes, ^{to} Tennessee in February last.

As a consequence, the weakly men, who usually drop into the grave or Hospitals during the first month or two of severe service of a new Regiment, are with us, If our transportation is sufficient ^{and} tolerably comfortable, these men may return to their friends ^{and} State, ^{being} useful citizens. Otherwise we shall drop ^{at} the General Hospitals along our route, or send them home bearing the seeds of disease ^{and} death.

Permit me to suggest, that the P.B. Companies should be required to furnish clean box cars, and that not more than twenty five men should be placed ^{one} in ~~a~~ car.
